

NATIONAL LAWMAKERS WILL SEE RESOURCES OF COLUMBIA BASIN

Ports Committee to Combat
Secret Opposition by Bring-
ing Congressmen Here.

As soon as the national congress takes a recess from tariff and currency, Dr. Alfred Kinney, chairman of the ports of Columbia committee, will convene an itinerant tri-state commerce congress successively in Spokane, Wash., Lewiston, Idaho, Portland and Astoria, Or.

"The congress will have three purposes," said Dr. Kinney today. "It will acquaint the national legislators with the resources and development needs of the Columbia basin."

He already has assurance of the attendance of 50 United States senators and representatives.

The plan, it is expected, will result in perfecting a defensive organization of all bodies in the \$90,000 square miles of the Columbia district to resist the efforts of Puget sound and transcontinental railroad interests to prevent the opening of the upper Columbia, the deepening of the channel from Portland to the sea and the removing of the bar at the mouth of the river.

Program to Be Laid Out.
A definite program for enlisting the people in support of water transportation and channel deepening will be formulated, it is stated. It will include

an educational campaign to be continued through the Columbia district showing the comparative costs of water and rail transportation, the rate decreasing influence of water competition.

All interests loyal to the future of the district will be more definitely pledged to support the campaign for deepening the channel over the Columbia river bar, including increased dredging capacity, an appropriation of \$2,000,000 instead of \$800,000 for jetty construction and the placing of the jetty work on a continuing contract basis.

Large Attendance Expected.
As many of the 15,000 members of the Ports of Columbia committee as can attend will be present at the sessions of the tri-state commerce congress in Spokane, Lewiston, Portland and Astoria.

Dr. Kinney believes that the successive gatherings by their attendance of national and state legislators and citizens will turn the eyes of the nation upon the resources and opportunities of the northwest and the determined effort of the people here for their development.

"The time has come for us to get together," said he, "to seek out and defeat the secret influence that would give us promises for soap, to move forward unitedly in support of our own vital development interests. We never before had such a support for an issue of general welfare. There was never so opportune a time to act."

Dr. Kinney expects that the four meetings planned may be held next month.

Miss Kellogg Was Ill.
Independence, Or., Oct. 8.—Believed to have been driven to it by despondency because of ill health, Miss Mamie Kellogg, of this city, committed suicide by jumping into the river. When search was made for her when she did not go home to supper, part of her clothes were found on the river bank. Her body was recovered.

GOOD ROADS PROVE OF VALUE IN KLICKITAT

Large Amount of Construction
Proceeding as Result of
Hill's Experiment.

The experiment of Samuel Hill in building good roads at Maryhill has borne excellent fruit in Klickitat county, Washington. The city of Goldendale has laid miles of street pavement, all uniform, and the general effect of the improvement is to bring the realization that the county seat is really called Goldendale.

In the county a large amount of road building is going on. Five miles on the road to Maryhill from Goldendale have been completed and when the remaining two and one quarter miles are finished the trip from Goldendale to the river can be made in three quarters of an hour by wagon and 10 minutes by automobile. The distance is 10 miles. The road will be a hard surface one, easy on the horses' feet and dustless.

North of Goldendale the county is building a road to Yakima, a distance of 20 miles. Eighteen miles of this road have been finished.

With its system of good roads, Klickitat county will have easy access to the river and the completion of the Cello canal will give cheaper transportation of its products to market, cutting the existing rates in half.

As an example of present freight conditions, when the river is not accessible to all points, it may be cited that the rates from Lyle, which is on the

river, to Portland, is 10 cents per hundred, while from Columbus or Maryhill it is 25 cents per hundred.

OREGON TO HAVE FINE LAND SHOW EXHIBIT

Oregon's exhibit at the Chicago land show, November 20 to December 8, will be 250 per cent better than it was last year, predicts C. C. Chapman, state immigration agent. Grasses and grains, pigs and beef, some fruit and fish, give, he says, the barest idea of the exhibit scheme, which is intended to show capably and dependably what the home-seeker desires.

Two white little pigs in clover and alfalfa, for instance, will typify an industry of growing importance. Mr. Chapman will personally direct the assembling of the exhibit, and will be in charge at Chicago, Governor West and the Oregon Development league have united in appointing members of the state immigration board commissioners for Oregon at the Chicago land show, and it is thought likely they may attend.

BARTENDER IS GIVEN ROCKPILE SENTENCE

Matthew Hagan, a bartender, was sentenced this morning in the municipal court to serve 60 days on the rockpile for selling liquor to an intoxicated man. Rev. Joseph Brock, superintendent of the Fishgah home at Lents, filed the complaint against Hagan.

Rev. Mr. Brock testified to having followed three men into the resorts where Hagan was at work and that one of the trio was considerably under the influence of liquor. Hagan sold the intoxicated man liquor without question, testified the minister. Hagan, his employer and the floorwalker at the saloon testified they could not remember the three men. Hagan was released upon a \$500 appeal bond.
