BOARD OF EDUCATION USES AX ON BUDGET IN RUTHLESS FASHION

Cut Last Night is From 10.6 Mills to 7.75; Further Pruning to Come.

The school board used an ax rather than a pruning knife on budget proposals at a meeting last night. Three of five school construction projects were cut out.

Proposals for additional grounds felt the same ruthless touch. The total estimate was reduced from \$595,000 to \$185,000. Proposals of expenditure for grounds of \$20,000 for Albina Home-stead, \$150,000 for Couch, \$60,000 for Hartman, \$15,000 each for Woodlawn and Woodstock, and \$150,000 for an athletic field were all eliminated.

Before the taxpayers' meeting is held November 25 many more reductions are to be made. Last night the board reduced the tax levy necessary for school purposes from 10.6 mills to 7.75 mills, approximately.

R. L. Sabie, chairman of the board, said conversation with certain taxpayers had caused him to conclude that to cut the levy down to 6 mills would be highly popular.

None of the figures, it is understood, are yet established. The board will continue its work of slashing, pruning, revising and modifying original budget estimates.
