

STEAMERS FOR ORIENTAL CARGOES

Orteric and Harpagus Are Expected Here to Load in December.

Although steam tonnage is still said to be hard to get, and rates are still holding up, the Royal Mail has chartered two more steamers for Oriental cargo...

The Orteric was just reported as sailing from Newcastle, N. S. W., for Valparaiso, on September 27, while the Harpagus sailed from the Australian port for Java on October 2.

The Drummond was chartered by Hines, Rolph & Co. for a voyage to Sydney with lumber from this coast while the market was well up, her rate being 60 shillings.

Since that time the rates have gone down until now they are about 45 sh. and as the bark only arrived at San Francisco from Newcastle, N. S. W., on October 1, the difference in rates meant a big loss on the cargo to Australia.

For this reason according to the report, the charterers decided that it would be cheaper to buy the vessel as the price paid would be less than the difference in the rates.

EMERY GETS VERDICT IN SUM OF \$9000

Local Stage Manager Who Was Shot Awarded Damages From Asylum.

Tacoma, Wash., Oct. 21.—H. F. Emery, stage manager of a Portland vaudeville theatre, today is awarded a verdict of \$9000 against Andrew J. Littlejohn and wife and Dr. A. P. Calhoun, superintendent of the insane asylum at Fort Stevens.

Emery sued for \$15,000 damages for permanent injuries sustained as a result of being shot by O. W. Pence, Mrs. Littlejohn's son, who, while on temporary discharge from the asylum, pursued a theatrical company to Portland to press his attentions upon one of the girl members.

The main point pleaded in the case was the lack of a law in this state permitting superintendents of insane hospitals to release patients on temporary discharge or parole to relatives.

It was due to Emery's efforts to protect the young actress from Pence that he was shot.
