

BOURNE URGES PLAN FOR DEEP SEA DOCK

Senator Would Have City Finance Harbor Improvement Scheme.

Former Senator Jonathan Bourne Jr. laid before the Progressive Business Men's club yesterday a plan whereby the city may finance the deep sea dock plan which involves the creation of a turning basin where Swan island now is. He proposed that the city secure 100 acres of land or so on both sides of the river in the vicinity of Swan island, that then the island be dredged out, leaving a turning basin 40 feet deep, the docks built on both sides of the river, and the land purchased before the improvement be made at its original value. He predicted that the city could accomplish all desired improvements and make money which could be put into a fund for future extension or present maintenance.

Answering a question as to the size of vessels that may be expected upon the opening of the Panama canal, Mr. Bourne said the dock at the canal are 1000 feet long, 110 wide and 40 feet deep. Ships of proportionate size may use the docks. To give them entrance to Portland the channel over the bar should be, he said, 50 feet deep and the channel in the river 40 or 45 feet deep.

The speaker declared that Oregon is potentially the richest state in the Union, that any expenditure looking toward development is warranted, no matter how large, and that all possible pressure should be brought to bear to have the north jetty completed, the bar dredged, the river channel deepened within two to three years.

A message received at the state department from the Vera Cruz consulate said Felix Diaz has not been molested by the Mexican authorities since he took refuge there. It was believed Huerta would be well enough satisfied to leave him there, inasmuch as he cannot interfere much in the election unless able to get out.
