

**WORLD CHAMPION HEN OF O. A. C. WILL VISIT PORTLAND NEXT WEEK**

**Fowl Which Has Record of 291 Eggs in One Year Will Be Exhibited.**

The champion laying hen of the world will come down to Portland from the Oregon Agricultural college next week to tell, with becoming pride and queenly chuckle, how she produced in a single year 291 good eggs.

Next Thursday, Friday and Saturday this remarkable fowl will be on exhibition at the Meier & Frank store. College "highbrows" will be on hand to explain in erudite fashion what science has done to give Oregon the champion hen of the world. But the hen, in her own peculiar way, will tell in her language, so plain that all other hens may understand, some of the secrets of the business which even the professors do not and cannot understand.

"Mrs. Hen" bears the commonplace name of "C-543," at present. This unassuming name signifies the class in which she belongs. The "C" means the year in which she was born, and the "543" means something or other connected with the classification of college fowls.

In outward appearance this wonderful hen is not particularly striking or unusual. She is pure white and weighs four pounds. Her family connections are of the best, however, for she was bred from a selected strain of stock. She is the progeny of a cross between a White Leghorn and a Barred Plymouth Rock. The hen was born April 28, 1912, at the experiment station of the Agricultural college.

This is not a pampered hen. She has never been fondled and made over, a "silver spoon" has never been in her mouth, and she has never read a book. Practically speaking she is plain hen so far as her culture is concerned. She is not a freak, but a phenomenal bird.

When 5 months old she deposited her first egg. The first year was up October 15, but not content to rest on the laurels already won, she kept steadily at it and has not taken a rest since establishing the great record. The best previous mark was 281 eggs, made by a Missouri hen, which afterward sold for \$400. The Oregon hen, however, is not for sale.

Professor James Dryden, head of the poultry department of the Oregon Agricultural college, says:

"In the future the eggs from the Oregon champion will be saved for hatching purposes. A number of chicks have already been obtained from her eggs and great things are expected from the hatchlings. We have received requests from fanciers and experts all over the country, for settings of eggs, and the hen is doing her part in brooding for Oregon."

No particular precautions in the matter of feeding the champion were taken. We gave her just such good, nourishing food as any poultry raiser would provide for his rocks. "C-543's" eggs are uniform in shape, white in color, and weigh on the average, two ounces.
