EFFORT TO FORM THREE YEARS AGO WAS FAILURE

Local Golfers Will Hold Their Annual Meeting Saturday, January 10.

The Waverly Country club will hold its annual meeting Saturday, January 10. A number of important questions will be brought before the board of directors at the time, including the proposition of organizing a Pacific Coast Golf association.

Local golf men do not look very favorably upon the organization of a Pacific Coast Golf association, although prominent golfers of Seattle, British Columbia and California are mentioned in dispatches as being behind a move to organize the length of the coast.

It is true that at various times northern golfers have entered California tournaments, and California players have entered northern tournaments; but that does not mean that such an organization will be formed this season or next, or perhaps before the 1915 season.

California has many prominent golf courses, and each year one of these courses would want the championship tournament, and where would the northwest clubs come in, they argue here.
