

CAUGHT ON TRESTLE, TWO ARE KILLED

One Girl Escapes as Southern Pacific Train Bears Down on Trio.

Oregon City, Jan. 8.—As a result of three young people choosing a long, dangerous railroad trestle instead of a safe bridge directly parallel with it, and intended for the use of pedestrians and vehicle traffic, Melvin Hagen and Alma Summerfield of Canby are dead. The boy and girl were struck by Southern Pacific train No. 11 at 7:23 last night on the long bridge across the Molalla river, between Canby and Barlow.

They, in company with Rosa Summerfield, sister of the dead girl, were walking to Barlow and started out on the railroad bridge instead of the wagon bridge. When they heard the train coming Rosa Summerfield was able to escape by running off the trestle, but the other two were caught and thrown to the ground, 90 feet below. Coroner Wilson of this city was notified and took charge of the bodies. He will hold an inquest as soon as he can get word of the crew in charge of the train.

Alma Summerfield was 18 years of age and the daughter of Edward Summerfield, a farmer living about half a mile southeast of Canby. Her sister is five years younger. Melvin Hagen, age 19 years, lived with his parents, Mr. and Mrs. C. P. Hagen, two miles from Canby. The party was on its way to Barlow to attend church services.

SAN PEDRO PREPARES FRONT FOR SHIPPING

Engineer Hegardt Finds Splendid Progress on Docks.

G. B. Hegardt, engineer of the commission of public docks, returned to Portland yesterday after a week's inspection trip of dock and harbor improvements in California. Mr. Hegardt visited San Francisco, San Diego and San Pedro in line with the policy of the commission to secure first hand information as to what other ports of the coast are doing in the way of dock and harbor construction. Similar inspection trips have already been made of the ports of Tacoma, Seattle and Vancouver, B. C.

At San Diego the engineer inspected the \$1,000,000 project now under way there, including a concrete pier 500 feet long and 130 feet in width and a concrete bulkhead 2570 feet long. This bulkhead is being built 1000 feet in shore from the harbor line and will reclaim 60 acres of land which will be leased for industrial purposes.

At San Diego where \$2,300,000 has already been spent for harbor improvements, \$2,500,000 more are available, part of which is being utilized for the construction of a double pier, 1200 feet long. Mr. Hegardt was practically impressed with the San Pedro harbor.

"It was a most successful trip," said Mr. Hegardt yesterday, "and I picked up many valuable pointers. I made a study of the means of construction, engineering problems and dock charges of the cities I visited."

San Diego, Cal., Jan. 8.—Mexican residents along the California border are uneasy and fearful today owing to a detachment of multicolored federal soldiers sent from Ensenada to Mexicali. Their exact whereabouts are unknown, but it is said they number several hundred and are in an ugly mood owing to their not being paid.

Many Mexican ranchers are preparing to move into United States territory.

Execution Is Denied.
Los Angeles, Jan. 8.—Reports that Didier Masson, French aviator, formerly employed by the Mexican constitutionalists, had been executed by federalists were denied here today by Constitutional Agent Alcade. Masson is said to have fulfilled his contract with the constitutionalists and is the proprietor of a grocery and commission house at Hermosillo, Sonora.

O'Shaughnessy at Vera Cruz.
Vera Cruz, Mex., Jan. 8.—Charge d'Affairs O'Shaughnessy of the United States embassy in Mexico City, arrived here today to confer with John Lind, President Wilson's personal representative.

O'Shaughnessy brought his wife with him, but they left their little son at the capital. It was believed this was to put an extinguisher on reports that they had closed the embassy and left Mexico City for good.

President Huerta offered the O'Shaughnessys a special train for the trip, but the charge d'affaires declined with thanks.

GIRL DISAPPEARS ON EVE OF HER WEDDING

San Francisco, Jan. 8.—Police at all bay cities were looking today for Miss Anna Ruffino, 18, who disappeared at the Ferry building yesterday afternoon, as she, Giuseppe Mascitelli and a party of friends were waiting to start for Martinez, where she and Mascitelli were to have been married last night.

The case puzzled the authorities. Mascitelli was taking Miss Ruffino from Concord, where her mother lives, to his own home in Martinez. At the Ferry building there was a momentary confusion and when the party reached the boat the prospective bride had vanished.
