

**WAR RUMORS GATHER  
OVER BALKANS AGAIN  
AS TURKS GIRD LOINS**

Fresh Hostilities Expected Through Sultan's Ambition to Regain Territory.

(United Press Lease Wire.)  
London, Jan. 9.—Earlier surmises that Enver Bey was named as minister of Turkey in a preliminary treaty with the Balkans. Balkans received confirmation today from several sources. That the sultan's representatives were negotiating at various European capitals is certain, and an attempt was made to conceal the fact that the money was wanted for war munitions. The Constantinople embassies of the various powers were also reporting to their chancelleries that military preparations were going on on an extensive scale.

Everything indicated also that the Constantinople government was responsible, as had already been guessed, for the talk of sending Izzet Pasha on the throne of Albania. Whether or not it was really believed at the Turkish capital that such a thing could be accomplished was generally doubted, but it was clear enough that the effort to attempt was bound to make would be to Turkey's advantage, assuming that it was planning more trouble.

With the Balkan allies exhausted as they are at present and with the Turkish army improved by the reorganization it is undergoing, military experts agreed that the sultan would stand an excellent chance not only of winning back all that he lost in the recent struggle, but of extending his territory. The sultan, of course, was taking it for granted that the powers did not interfere. That they would want to do so was considered certain, but in view of Europe's many international resources and the danger of interfering in Balkan affairs, even the best judges of diplomatic matters thought it was unsafe to predict too confidently what would happen.

**WILLIAM HENRY CLARK  
WAS GOLD HUNTER**

John Day, Or., Jan. 9.—In the death of William Henry Clark at Canyon City, January 4, Grant county lost one of its oldest and best known pioneers. Mr. Clark had been a resident of this county since 1881, coming here from California. He was born in Indiana, and was 78 years old. He was one of the gold seekers who went to California during the rush of 1849. In 1860 he started for the placer district of Orfino, Idaho. During his overland journey he heard of the gold strikes on Canyon creek and made that his destination. He has resided at Canyon City ever since.

**ALBANY WILL SOON  
HAVE NEW POSTOFFICE**

Albany, Or., Jan. 9.—That actual construction work will start on the Albany postoffice and federal building April 1, to be completed within a year thereafter, was a statement of Fred A. Erickson, Salem contractor, who was awarded the contract for the lowest bid, \$68,282. Mr. Erickson is in the city looking the site over and conferring with Postmaster Van Wagon. Mr. Erickson said that he had received notice of the approval of his bid and the official acceptance of the contract. It calls for a two-story structure with a ground area of 4700 feet, stucco, stone and terra cotta facing with tin roof, including mechanical equipment, interior lighting fixtures and approaches.
