

IRRIGATION DISTRICT SUED BY LUMBERMEN

Oregon Company Claims the
Prior Rights to Use of
Hood-River Water.

Hood River, Or., Jan. 16.—The Oregon Lumber company, owner of the sawmill plant at Hood, on the line of the Mount Hood railroad, has filed suit in the Hood River county circuit court to enjoin the East Fork Irrigation district from diverting the waters of Hood river into the proposed enlarged ditch of the district. The irrigation district was recently organized under the provisions of the state laws and the members in that district are applying for the issuance and sale of \$150,000 worth of water bonds with which to purchase the plant of the East Fork Irrigation company now supplying water on the east side of the Hood River valley. The present system of the East Fork Irrigation company is owned and operated by a private corporation, while the local board of health, members of the school board and the civic committee of the local woman's club. Steps are to be taken immediately for the fumigation of all places where there has been an outbreak of the disease, and a more rigid enforcement of the isolation law is to be effected in the Glenwood and Glimmer districts. The committees also are to communicate with the health officials in Skamania City relative to some cases known to exist there.

SMALLPOX SPREADS IN THE BACK COUNTRY

Health Officials at White Salmon
Take Steps to Fight
Disease.

White Salmon, Wash., Jan. 16.—Because of an epidemic of smallpox in the back country and among the Indians, State Sanitary Inspector Wilbur of Seattle, who has just come from Centralia, where he has been investigating the typhoid epidemic, held a meeting here for the purpose of planning to combat the spread of smallpox in the valley. County Health Officer Bonebrake of Goldendale and County Commissioner Morgan, also of Goldendale, were present, as also were members of the local board of health, members of the school board and the civic committee of the local woman's club. Steps are to be taken immediately for the fumigation of all places where there has been an outbreak of the disease, and a more rigid enforcement of the isolation law is to be effected in the Glenwood and Glimmer districts. The committees also are to communicate with the health officials in Skamania City relative to some cases known to exist there.

GOOD YEAR FOR DAIRY AT TROUTLAKE, WASH.

Troutlake, Wash., Jan. 16.—The annual report of the secretary of the Troutlake Dairy association, shows an increase of dairy cows and cream in Troutlake valley. The board of directors of the association in sanguine over the outlook for the coming year, and the interests of the district which supplies the local creamery. More interest is being taken in dairying in Troutlake valley, more and better butter producing cattle are being added to local herds and it is the intention of more settlers to go into dairy work here than before.

During the year 47,650 pounds of butterfat were received at the local factory, from which 69,205 pounds of butter were made.
The highest price paid here for butterfat during the year was 38 cents a pound and the lowest was 28 1/4 cents a pound. The increase in output over 1912 was 18,522 pounds of butter. Most of the product went to Portland markets.

MARKED MONEY AS EVIDENCE IN CASE

Work has been delayed by the non-arrival of a steam shovel from the east, but will begin soon. The bonds have been finally accepted by the eastern bond buyers, and the funds will be available early in February.
