

CATTLE PRICES ARE FIRMER IN THE EAST, BUT REMAIN WEAK HERE

EGGS ARE WEAKER WITH SALES SHOWN AT FURTHER DECLINE

Front Street Not Quoting Above 34c for Canned Goods and Few Are Holding Above 33c; Supplies Increase Along Street.

Today's Produce Trade. Egg prices lower. Northwest buying potatoes. Chickens are lower. Meat markets are steady.

The egg market has turned weaker, and sales of candied stock were reported generally at 34c a dozen, although it was stated that one lot went at 33c.

As a general rule nothing above 32c was being asked for case count stock, and little movement was reported in this line above 21c; in fact a 20c market for the general run of supplies could be safely considered the best established market.

With Puget sound actually selling eggs below front street, the outside demand has been curtailed to a considerable extent. In fact, unless the outside business will vanish, the movement of eggs to the wholesale market during the last 24 hours. All receivers report a general decline in the country, and none are willing to carry stocks over from day to day.

CHICKEN PRICES ARE WEAKER There is a somewhat weaker tone in the chicken trade generally along the street. Sales were made down to 15c a pound for the best, and in some quarters it is believed that lower prices will be forced.

BUTTER MARKET VERY WEAK Very weak prices are showing in the butter market, and the best prices were quoted 20c today for best prints, several were still holding out for 23c.

SOME STURGEON IS COMING A small supply of Columbia river sturgeon was shown in the local wholesale market today. The stock found a ready demand at 13c a pound.

CALIFORNIA CABBAGE IS IN California cabbage has arrived in the local market in quite fair condition. An initial shipment for the season is reported from Los Angeles. The stock is quoted at 2 1/2c a pound, while local is firm at 2 1/2c to 2 3/4c.

LEMON PRICES ARE SHADED Prices in the lemon market are generally being shaded. While a few dealers are holding out for extreme figures, others are losing no sales with the price from 15c to 18c a bushel.

SHIPPERS' WEATHER GUIDE Weather bureau sends the following note to shippers: Protect shippers as far north as Seattle against minimum temperatures about 38 degrees below zero.
