

### DE PALMA NEVER PUT BRAKES ON RACER IN VANDERBILT CUP RACE

Perfect Mechanical Score Enables Race Driver to Repeat in Classic Event.

Santa Monica, Cal., Feb. 27.—A perfect mechanical score enabled Ralph De Palma to capture the Vanderbilt cup yesterday for the second consecutive time, according to the verdict of today of automobile experts gathered here for the races.

that he completed the 254 miles of the race without a stop stands as the most noteworthy achievement of the race. Barney Oldfield, runner-up, who forced De Palma to the limit in the most grueling, heart-breaking duel ever seen on a southern California track, divided public commendation today with the winner. In spite of three visits to the pits, Oldfield finished but one minute and 29 seconds behind De Palma, who traveled the route in 3 hours, 53 minutes and 41 seconds, at an average speed of 75.5 miles an hour, breaking the Vanderbilt cup record.
