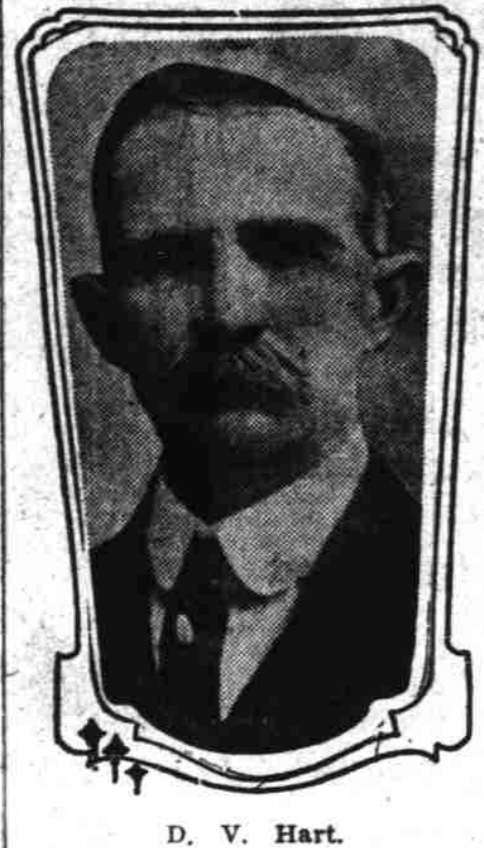


### TOOTHsome SALMON IS HONORED TODAY THROUGHOUT NATION

### COMMISSIONER HART IS CANDIDATE AGAIN



Combine County and City Governments to Save Expense His Slogan.

County Commissioner D. V. Hart announced yesterday that he will be a candidate for reelection to the office he now holds and will file his declaration as a candidate for the Republican nomination at the May primaries this afternoon. Mr. Hart has been in office for three years and is completing his first term. His slogan is "Reelection for second term. Combination of city and county to save expense." His statement is as follows: "If I am nominated and elected, I will, during my term of office, stand for strict economy in all things; for a business-like expenditure of money, to down extravagance; for a combination of county and city governments, even should it legislate me out of office; continue my good roads policy for producers; produce food on the county schools for all institutions, including jails. The county should feed the inmates of our jails, instead of an individual."

### DR. SMITH INDORSES FLY SWATTING MOVE

Candidate for Governor Says Disease Breeder Can Be Removed.

Dr. C. J. Smith, Democratic candidate for governor, speaking before a large audience at a regular meeting of the Ockley Green Parent-Teacher association yesterday afternoon, commended the proposed "swat the fly" campaign of the Portland Parent-Teacher associations.

Dr. Smith draw from his subject numerous interesting and striking thoughts and much added enthusiasm, and impetus to the "swat the fly" movement was given by his address. Dr. Smith was one of the first of Oregon's medical fraternity to point out the deadly nature of the common fly as a disease breeder and the possibilities of its extermination, through a paper read at Hot Lake some years ago.

The food value of canned salmon as compared with other foodstuffs is shown in the following extract from the department's bulletin: "The cheapest food is that which supplies nutriment at the lowest cost. One pound of one of the best methods, the same quantity of bone, muscle, blood and brain building material, body fuel in other foods would cost: Eggs, strictly fresh (at 34 cents per dozen) ..... 28 Cents. Steak, sirloin (at 27 1/2 cents per pound) ..... 33 Mutton, leg (at 19 cents per pound) ..... 32 Chicken, average (at 25 cents per pound) ..... 21 1/4 Ham, smoked (at 18 cents per pound) ..... 18 1/2 Pink salmon, canned (at 9 cents per can) ..... 12 1/2 Ham is apparently cheaper than the other meats because it contains more fat or fuel, the need of nutritive ingredients, which can be supplied more cheaply by the vegetable food which should accompany the meat or fish.

### SCHOOL PAYROLL REACHES HIGH NOTCH

Yesterday was the banner day in the payroll history of the Portland school district, as \$114,688.35 is to be disbursed in 1445 checks. During the previous school year the highest month's payroll was a trifle over \$101,000. Owing to the closing of eight schools it is expected that the amount will decrease materially during the remainder of the year.

The request was granted.

### WOMAN'S ATTEMPT AT SUICIDE SUCCESSFUL

Mrs. F. A. Taylor, 1084 East Yamhill street, who shot herself through the stomach last week, died this morning at 6:30 o'clock at the Good Samaritan hospital. She was the wife of the furniture dealer at 130 Tenth street. According to the family version, the shooting was an attempt at suicide at 6 o'clock in the morning at the family home. A 22 caliber revolver was used, the bullet making two perforations in the stomach, the wounds indicating that the weapon had been held at close range and directly in front of the woman.

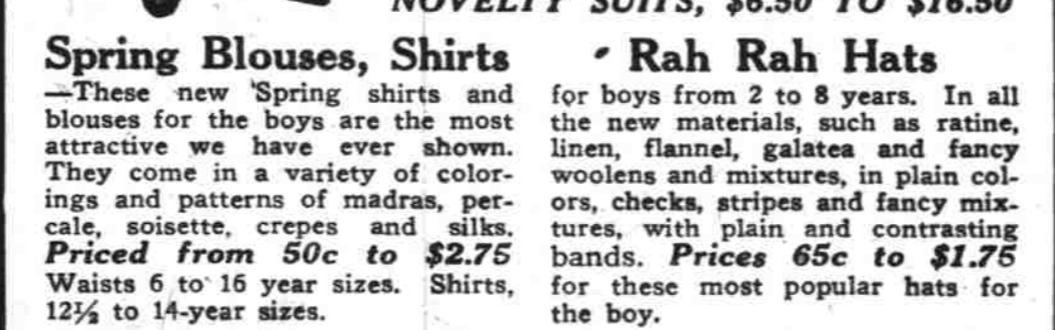
