SUPERINTENDENT GIVES SCHOOL WORK REVIEW

City Superintendent of Schools L. R. Alderman was the featured speaker at the Portland Commercial club luncheon yesterday. Mr. Alderman gave a review of the work of the public schools and pointed out new features that have been added, and are to be added as soon as possible, and urged every business man and every citizen to take a more active part in school matters. "We believe that the things that count are habits," said Mr. Alderman; "and if good habits are established during the school days, we will have better men and better women. We are controlled largely by habits, and habits are largely the determining factors in life." Industry he classified as one of the most important of habits leading to success. Education without a purpose, he pointed out as useless and a waste of time.

Among new things to be taken up, he said, is the enlargement of the scope of studies for the purpose of concentrating in what particular line the individual pupil is most interested. This accomplished, it will be possible to better specialize. He says that in his opinion that primary grades should devote only half a day to studies. Children 8 or 7 years old, he said, learn in half a day about all they can absorb in a day. Under direction of F. E. Chapman, director of music of the public schools, the Boys' Glee club of the Lincoln high school rendered several much enjoyed four part songs.

PUBLIC DEFENDER IDEA WINS HIS APPROVAL

In closing his two weeks work as public defender the municipal court, Attorney Emil Nelson adds his approval to the scheme started by Judge Stevenson, and says it should be permanent. Only one man refused the free legal advice offered by the attorney. This man was arrested a second time within the two weeks. "One prominent thing emphasized by the work," says Attorney Nelson, "is that more discretion should be used by the officer in making arrests. Many cases are brought into court that could easily be settled upon the spot. This would relieve the court, save the police department much time and also be a saving to the city. "I found many men had good legal defenses, but had no money with which to employ counsel. I consider it the defender's business to see that such defenses are brought out in court, that the defendant has a chance to tell his story, and tell the material points in his favor. Much evidence gathered by the prosecution is heresy evidence. Beginning Monday, Attorney O. M. Hickey will give free service to the court as public defender.

University Opens New Buildings. Washington, March 14.—The Catholic university today completed its program to open a new dining hall and dormitory tomorrow. The structure of gothic style is 240 feet long. Only a portion of the building will be used at first. The total cost will be \$250,000.
