Photograph One of Many to Be Shown at "Father" Flinn's Birthday Party.

ONE SURVIVOR IS HERE

Three Other Members of Body Organized 63 Years Ago Live at Various Places on Coast.

A copy of a photograph of the first choir of the Taylor Street Methodist Episcopal church, taken in 1850, will be one of the many pictures and slides to be shown by George L. Himes, assistant secretary of the Oregon Historical society, at the birthday party to be given in honor of the Rev. John (Father) J. Flinn tomorrow night.

The choir was organized in December, 1850, and the original picture was taken by James B. Roberts with a daguerrotype camera. It was purchased from Dr. Dorsey S. Baker, who conducted a store at the corner of Front and Alder streets. Mr. Roberts later sold the picture to H. H. Griffen.

The group in the picture stood on the west side of First street just south of Stark, when they posed for Mr. Roberts' camera.

The original daguerrotype from which the photograph in Mrs. Himes' possession was taken, was owned by Mrs. E. B. Comfort, a member of the choir, who in the early fifties moved from Portland to The Dalles, and thence to Salem.

Those represented in the picture include Miss Mary Davis (afterwards Mrs. D. W. Burnham), Mrs. E. B. Comfort, Miss Mary Purple, Mrs. George A. Barnes, Miss Emily Roberts (afterwards Mrs. E. H. Griffin), Miss Charlotte Barnes (afterwards Mrs. John Scott), Miss Sarah Davis (afterwards Mrs. George L. Story), Miss Evaline Chapman (afterwards Mrs. Simon B. Maye), whose husband was the third mayor of Portland.

The men included George A. Barnes, T. Brooks Trevett, Houston Roberts, Thomas A. Barnes, James H. Roberts, Captain Baker, Dr. Edward H. Griffin, organizer and leader of the choir, Warren S. Davis, Abalom B. Hallock, Thomas A. Davis, John Miller Murphy and Dr. J. A. Davenport.

Of those represented in the picture, three, however, were not choir members, George A. Barnes, Captain Baker and Dr. Davenport.

Of this number but four survive, Mrs. Charlotte Barnes Scott of Olympia, Wash., Dr. James H. Roberts of San Francisco, John Miller Murphy of Olympia, Wash., and Mrs. Emily Roberts Griffin of Portland. Mrs. Griffin will be the only survivor of the choir who will be present at the thirty-seventh birthday party of "Father" Flinn at the Taylor Street church tomorrow night.

Site for Shattuck School Discussed

Committees of Property Owners Present to Favor or Oppose Location on Park Blocks.

At a special meeting of the school board Monday night tentative plans for the three-day vacation, April 15, 16 and 17, were favorably considered; committees for and against a proposition to place a new school building in the Shattuck district along the park blocks were organized. Directors Sommer and Plummer urged the appointment of two physicians employed to treat deficient children.

When the advisability of constructing a new building on the park blocks was up, J. Frank Watson, speaking for 36 other property owners, opposed it. He declared the presence of a school would damage his personal holdings to the extent of \$20,000.

A large number of people present took the opposite view and several times Chairman Sabin had to call for order on account of protests against statements made by Watson.

Finally Chairman Sabin said the problem might be solved by making use of the old reservoir block at Sixth and Grant streets, which is owned by the city, but which can be secured by the board.

Pensions aggregating \$97.50 were allowed by the case committee of the juvenile court to widows with children and two others for \$32.50 and \$10 respectively, were discontinued. Pensions were granted as follows: Mrs. Rena Holman, 119 East Twenty-ninth street, north, \$10; Mrs. Louise Doty, 185 Caruthers street, \$10; Mrs. Marie Keeger, 708 Richmond street, \$10; Mrs. Martha Stewart, Gresham, \$10; Mrs. Marie Lefebvre, 203 Casson street, \$32.50; Mrs. Mabel Martindale, 355 Falling street, \$17.50. Mrs. Louis McTaggart was allowed an increase from \$10 to \$17.50. The pension of \$32.50 to Mrs. Cora Cuneo was discontinued as she has been sent with her family to Cuneo's mother in Los Angeles. Cuneo is afflicted with tuberculosis of the bones and light work will be secured for him in California. The pension was discontinued because the woman has received \$2500 from a damage suit.

Negro May Face Serious Charge

Federal Officer Met at Door With Gun; Revolver Wrested Away From Man; Awaiting Grand Jury.

J. W. Hamilton, negro, was brought to Portland yesterday morning by Deputy United States Marshal Fuller from Klamath Falls, where he was arrested for selling whiskey on the Klamath reservation. Hamilton was arrested Friday in his cabin at the outskirts of the city. He came to the door, when the officers rapped, according to Fuller, armed with a caliber pistol. The Portland man seized Hamilton's arm and jerked the gun away. He is now in the county jail awaiting action of the federal grand jury.
