### Farmer Cannot Find Seed Corn Enough

Application by Madras Man to O-W. R. & N. Sends Agriculturist Scouring Around Country to Find It. I. A. Taylor of Madras, Or., is trying to find enough acclimated seed corn to plant 300 acres. His project is so far the largest individual venture in corn so far undertaken in the Pacific northwest. Applying to C. L. Smith, agriculturist of the O-W. R. & N., for help in getting this seed, Mr. Taylor found

that there isn't enough in this part of the country. What he wants is Minnesota King, a variety particularly suitable for the Oregon central highlands. Mr. Smith accordingly has gone to Spokane to see if he can secure up enough seed in that locality. He will need a ton and a half. Three hundred acre corn fields are common in the eastern so-called "corn states," but the industry in Oregon is still so young that the farm of that size here is causing somewhat of a sensation in agricultural circles.
