

ACKERSON OBJECTS TO MOORES' LETTER IN CAMPAIGN PAMPHLET

Candidate for National Committeeman Asserts to Secretary State Attack Made.

LAW VIOLATION CHARGED

Attention Called to Statute Which States Equal Room Be Given to Opponent.

Protest has been filed with Secretary of State Oloott by Charles W. Ackerson, candidate for Republican committeeman for Oregon, against the inclusion in the official campaign pamphlet of a letter written by C. B. Moores, member of the dock commission, urging Republicans to vote for Ralph Williams, incumbent, and attacking Mr. Ackerson.

Mr. Ackerson states that Mr. Moores' letter is in violation of that section of the Oregon law which provides that each candidate against whom letters of opposition are written shall have equal space in the booklet to state his side of the issue.

He contends that Mr. Moores' letter is both an argument in favor of one candidate and an argument against another. This, declares Mr. Ackerson, is unlawful.

The paragraph to which Ackerson objects reads:

Change in Registration Noted.

"C. W. Ackerson registered as a Progressive on January 8 this year, and on March 14 last, changed his registration to Republican, and immediately filed his declaration for Republican national committeeman, clearly showing that his change in politics was for office only, as within 24 hours after he became a Republican he was a candidate for one of the most important offices in the gift of the party.

"The average man is fair-minded, and every consideration of fair play calls for the selection of a man for this important office, who is and has been a consistent Republican, and who has given his time and energy in the interest of the Republican party, and not a new convert who becomes a Republican just the day before he announces his candidacy for office. As a consistent Republican we should vote for a man whose Republicanism is unimpaired."

Mr. Ackerson's letter to Secretary Oloott follows:

Ackerson's Letter.

"I beg to call your attention to Page 2, last paragraph, of the official pamphlet for the primary nominating election, May 15, 1914, same being an article entitled 'Ralph E. Williams, Candidate for Republican Party for National Committeeman' and signed 'Chas. B. Moores.' Information furnished by Chas. B. Moores, first copies of which were run from the press April 17. I note that on the page occupied by Ralph E. Williams, one paragraph is in the nature of an attack upon or of argument against my nomination.

"It seems clear to me that this is in violation of Section 3487 of Lord's Oregon Laws, which, after providing for the filing of statements by the candidates, or their friends, says: 'Any person or persons opposing the nomination of any such candidate may, not later than the 30th day, before said nominating election, file with the secretary of state their typewritten or printed statements over their signatures of the reasons why such candidate should not be nominated, and every such statement should be accompanied by proof, by affidavit, or sheriff's return, that they have caused to be served personally and in person, upon such candidate a true copy of such statement. Each candidate shall be allowed one page of printed matter and those opposing him shall each be allowed one page of space on equal terms with him as hereinafter provided.'

"I believe this has always been construed to forbid an argument against one candidate being included in the argument in favor of another.

Alleges Violation of Law.

"These gentlemen who have with supreme disregard and contempt violated the laws of Oregon are the same who rode over and trampled under foot the wishes of the majority as expressed in the primary elections of 1912.

"Who is this Charles B. Moores? Is he the same Charles B. Moores who, in his mad attempt to force Taft, the minority candidate, on to the majority of the Republican party, brought about the defeat of that able and grand character, Honorable Ben Selling, for United States senator?

"Secretly and under cover of darkness, these men have slipped into the voters' pamphlet and attempt to take away a right granted and guaranteed to me under the Oregon primary system, the right of fair play, the right to refute an argument against me.

"Under section 3487, Lord's Oregon laws, I am entitled to be served personally and in person with a true copy of any argument against my candidacy.

Minority Party Victories.

"The leopard cannot change its spots and once more we have an example of the methods of the old gang, the methods which have torn asunder the Republican party and have made it easy for the minority party to place its candidates in high offices in the normal Republican state of Oregon.

"Under the rule of Ralph Williams, as committeeman, we have witnessed men of high standing and lofty character sent down to ignominious defeat by the minority.

"For the first time in the history of the nation, the voters have an opportunity to decide who will lead the party as national committeemen. Under the old system, six men in the back room of some hotel, 2000 miles from home, fixed up the deal to suit themselves. We have the supreme opportunity to bury the standard bearer of the old steam roller crowd on May 15.

"Well knowing that I have against me the most powerful, sinister and unscrupulous politicians in the state, I ask that you, as an impartial officer of the state of Oregon, see that I receive all the rights and privileges granted to me under the Oregon primary system.
