

FISHER'S DRIVE IN NINTH BRINGS OVER SCORE THAT COUNTS

Kores Opens Final Frame With Safe Hit and Beaver Backstop Finishes Fiesta. MARTINONI MAKES BOW

With David Bancroft on third base in the ninth inning yesterday and two out, Gus Fisher roused a ball down the first base line at the rate of a mile a minute and the game was over, 4 to 3. Elmerat Martinoni made his debut as a Coast leaguer and was hard to hit though magnanimous in the matter of allowing passes, two of which were later converted into scores. Pete Standridge pitched for the Seals and although he was hit hard, managed to keep the runs down to a quartet. Six Heavers had grounded to Charles and the Seal utility first sacker threw a couple more out to Standridge, but nobody could get over the drive of Fisher, which would have been good for two bases had it been necessary.

Buddy Ryan was the real clean kid of the day, and his double in the first and single in the third chased in the first three runs for the home-sters. Portland started off in the lead in the first inning when Herrick singled through short and stole second. He took third on Rodgers' out and scored when Buddy hit the ball against the right center field fence for two sacks. Buddy died on second as Charles threw Kores out to Bancroft.

Fitz Ties Score Up. Flash Fitzgerald tied the score up momentarily in the first half of the third with two out, when he singled across second and stole as Martinoni struck him his arms. O'Leary followed with a walk and scored on Schaller's drive across second base. It put O'Leary on third and Biff stole second without being harassed, but Kores threw Downs out at first and ended the inning.

The Heavers eased into the lead again in their half of the inning. Doane was safe when Corban failed to handle his grounder. Herrick followed with a short fly that Schaller couldn't reach and Rodgers sacrificed the pair along. Then came Buddy with his cleanup clout over second base.

Fitzgerald gave the home guard a whole lot of trouble on the bases. The little speed marvel walked in the fifth after two were out and started to steal second. He never stopped moving until he had crossed the plate. First Fisher's throw was bad and Fitz went on to third. Doane raced in to cut off the flash at third and his throw sailed away from the infielders and brought up against the grandstand and it was an easy matter for Fitz to skate home.

After Downs was out in the eighth, the Seals got in motion again. Munderoff worked Marty for a walk, the twirler's sixth of the matinee. Charles hit terrifically down to Davis and with a double in sight, Bobby fouled, but picked the bulb up in time to retire Chapple at first. Corban routed one to Travis too hot to handle and Munderoff tallied. Seaver raised a long skier to Ryan, and after that the lad with the spaghetti handle was able to retch the flipped tribe.

Kores Starts Finish. Kores drove a terrific single between Corban and O'Leary to start the ninth and Bancroft was sent in to run for the stragglers. Teuton, Lober sacrificed, Standridge to Charles, and Davis followed with a smash to Downs. Being out at first, this put Bancroft on third and he had only to walk on.
