MARION 'PROHIS' WILL AT COMING ELECTION

Will Select, as Far as Possible, Candidates of Other Parties Who Are "Drys."

CHAFIN IS THE SPEAKER

One Hundred Delegates Present; Committee Appointed to Report Later.

(Salem Bureau of The Journal.) Salem, Or., April 30,-At the largest Prohibition party convention ever held in Marion county, it was decided yesterday afternoon to put a complete county ticket in the field, selecting as far as possible candidates in the other parties who will espouse the cause of the "drys," A committee of nine was appointed on nominations and will report at an adjourned meeting of the convention, May 8.

By nominating candidates already in the race for office in the other parties, the "prohis" hope that the combined forces will be able to elect practically a full ticket. They believe they hold the balance of power. Candidates indersed by the prohibitionists must not only be out and out in favor of state and national prohibition, but they must agree to continue in the race on the Prohibition ticket in the event they are defeated in the primaries on the Republican or Democratic ticket, as the case may be.

Bristol of Jefferson, secretary Those appointed on the nominating committee were Julius Voget, Salem, chairman; Mr. Livesley, Woodburn; A J. Cook, Salem; Rev. Mr. Bristol, Jefferson; J. N. Smith, Salem; G. W. Farris, Turner; Mr. Moore, Turner; Mr. Coulsen, Scotts Mills, and J. M. Brown, Silverton.




