

CLUBS OF CITY SHOULD ALL GET TOGETHER TO SUPPORT ALASKA LINE

Plan Advocated by R. D. Carpenter Before Meeting of Portland Ad Club.

RESOLUTIONS PRESENTED

Other Enterprises for Good of City Need United Action to Succeed; Nothing Accomplished Haphazard.

"There ought to be means whereby all the clubs of Portland might get together in support of the Portland-Alaska steamship line," declared R. D. Carpenter, assistant manager of the Meier & Frank company, before the Ad club yesterday.

"There are other enterprises that require united, community action in order to insure their success. We cannot get united action by haphazard," Mr. Carpenter then submitted resolutions providing for the organization of a council of clubs, through the appointment of an Ad club committee which will secure action from other clubs.

Whereas, There are a number of large and influential clubs in the city of Portland, and

Whereas, All of these clubs are striving to the best of their individual powers to promote every element that is for the ultimate good of Portland, and to foster the ideal community spirit within our city, and

Whereas, There is strength in union, be it

Resolved, That the president of the Portland Ad club confer with the presidents of the other clubs of the city with the object of forming a council of clubs for the purpose of securing prompt joint action on all matters for the good of the community, which require undivided effort, and be it further

Resolved, That it is the wish of the Portland Ad club to see a joint committee formed in the very near future to take up and organize a council of clubs and work out a set of by-laws, rules and regulations for same.

Interrupt Lecturer With Cries of "Liar"

Near-Riot Occurs When Speaker Delivers Attack on Principles of Socialism at Lincoln High School.

David Goldstein's lecture on "Socialism vs. Christianity" at the Lincoln high school last night, under the auspices of the Knights of Columbus, resulted in a near-riot on account of constant interruptions and shouts of "Liar" by people in the audience.

The uproar was caused when Goldstein read excerpts from Socialist books which resulted in charges that he had not read them correctly. Goldstein invited a Socialist to the stand to read the passages. They were found correct, but the man insisted on making an explanation, and finally had to be forced from the stand by threats of arrest.

Goldstein took the attitude that Socialism is opposed to Christianity and the family.

He had been a Socialist once, he said, but had changed his mind because study convinced him the theory contrary to "the eternal principles which guide man's life properly."

Goldstein was constantly interrupted by hisses, catcalls and shouts of "Liar" and at the conclusion Socialists promised to answer Goldstein at the Lincoln high school next week.

Attorney Frank Collier presided.

Made-in-Oregon Day Is Observed

Portland Ad Club Turns Out in Force to Sample Local Products in Basement of Meier & Frank Store.

Yesterday was Ad club day at the "Made-in-Oregon" exhibit which the Manufacturers' association is holding in the basement of Meier & Frank's department store, and members of the organization swarmed among the booths, admiring the various displays of goods and not forgetting to sample the foodstuffs which Oregon concerns make.

These range from excellent biscuits and cakes made from Oregon flour to hams from Oregon hogs and fruits and gelatines.

There are half a hundred booths housed in the basement, all filled with samples of made-in-Oregon goods, and every day since the exhibit opened last week, the place has been thronged with visitors, many of whom had no idea of the number and diversity of articles which are manufactured within the state.

"People are coming to learn the value of keeping Oregon dollars in Oregon," said one of the exhibitors. "The exhibit has awakened many people to the importance of patronizing home industry, and has shown them that Oregon manufactured products are equal in every way to the imported stuffs, and can be purchased just as cheaply."

The exhibit will not close until late next week.

Judgment Creditor Is After His Money

Laborer Who Secured Damage Verdict Against Contracting Firm Alleges Concern Is Preferred to Others.

In an effort to force the McNinis & Reed Co., construction contractors, into involuntary bankruptcy, the suit of Arthur Askatin, a laborer, who is seeking to collect a personal injury judgment against the concern, is on trial in Judge Bean's division of the federal court.

Askatin was employed in the construction of the Multnomah club building and received injuries, for which later he was awarded \$6000 from the contractors by a jury in the circuit court.

Despite this ruling, attorneys for Askatin assert that the judgment was never paid, and that Alex McNinis, president of the concern, repeatedly preferred creditors in satisfying the latter's demands.

Of a payment of \$18,000 made to him last October by the Multnomah club, it was testified that the major portion was immediately paid to the United States National bank. The plaintiff also asserts that McNinis was paid liability insurance to cover Askatin's accident, but this money, it is claimed, was used for the purchase of land, rather than to satisfy Askatin's claim.

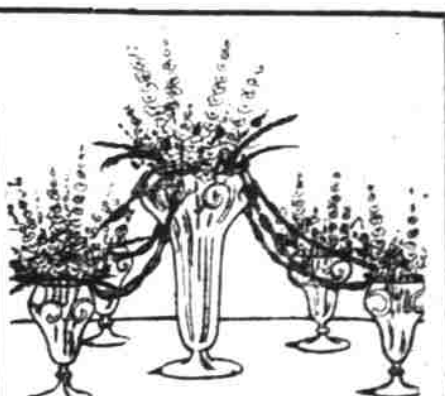
