

MEDIATORS AGREE TO SUGGEST COMMISSION TO SUCCEED HUERTA

They Would Let Federals Name Two Members, Rebels Two and They the 5th.

MAY PROVE SOLUTION

Mediators Will Go to Niagara Falls Saturday to Begin Conference With International Delegates.

By John Edwin Nevin. Washington, May 13.—That they had agreed on a general plan for settling Mexico's troubles was confirmed here today by the five mediators.

Huerta May Balk. The Mexicans were expected to insist, in the first place, that the mediator should be the only thing to be arbitrated, or at any rate it must be disposed of before the general situation in Mexico is discussed.

The Mexican envoys were due in Niagara Falls Saturday. Through the mediators, the Washington administration notified the Mexican government that it has no intention of holding Lobos island, off the Mexican coast, between Vera Cruz and Tampico, where a railway is to be built.

There we found Walter Whiffen, who had been confined for 24 hours without a bed, linen or sanitary facilities. Sutton and I were immediately

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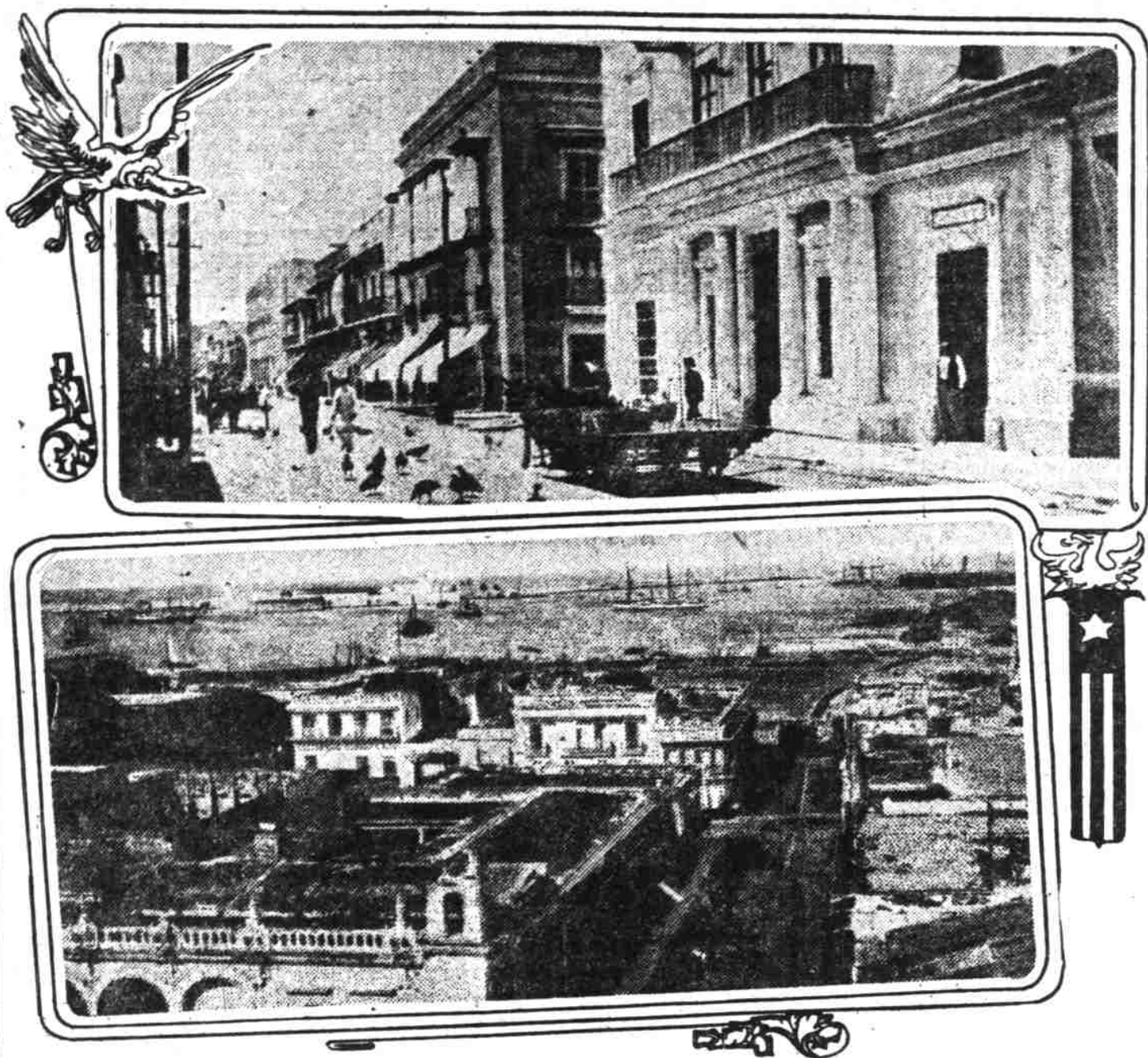

by mail or cable during our stay there. Furthermore, we gave our people role to notify the police before leaving.

We went out of the legation into the city to find lodgings and food. Suspicion and menace were in the air.

The Huerta government cannot afford to starve as it is for revenue and ammunition, and presently it must fall. How long it can resist Villa's advance is problematical.

Trade is at a standstill. No freight is moving on the railroads and oil fuel is becoming so scarce that the number of passenger trains has been radically reduced.

People fear a sack of the city by the victorious Villistas, or its looting by the mob if General Huerta be killed or overthrown by a local revolution.

Everywhere I asked two questions. First—"If General Huerta resigns and the Carranzistas consent to a compromise...

But none of those with whom I talked was sanguine. All thought a compromise possible rather than probable.

Second—"Is a single presidential autocrat necessary to the preservation of order in Mexico?"

The general gave us permission to leave the city. We hurried by the bombarded Young Men's Christian Association building to the French special train on which we had been invited to go to Puerto Mexico.

"BALD JACK" ADMITS HE WAS MISTAKEN IN EARLIER TESTIMONY

Attorney Manton, Representing Becker, Tangles Up State's Chief Witness.

ROSE ADMITS HE TOLD LIE

All Through Morning Session Rose Kept Cool and Manton Was Unable to Shake His Story.

(United Press Leased Wire.) New York, May 13.—A bitter cross-examination of "Bald Jack" Rose, one of the prosecution's principal witnesses against former Police Lieutenant Charles F. Becker, of trial here for the murder of Herman Rosenthal, was conducted today by Defense Attorney Manton.

Becker appeared grave and careworn throughout the morning, and seemed to realize that Manton made but little headway in discrediting Rose's accusations. With direct questions, Manton accused Rose of teaching boys to steal, ruining girls, pandering and belonging to a gambling club.

Attorney Manton succeeded during the afternoon session in tangling up Rose, who admitted that he knew Spanish Louie personally, and that his previous testimony to the contrary was false.
