

MILL CITY BUSINESS  
STREET ON LINN SIDE,  
IS DESTROYED BY FIRE

New Odd Fellows Building Is  
Among Structures Which  
Go Down Before Flames.

ONE STREAM AVAILABLE

Most of Stock and Furniture Saved  
From Burned Places Stacked  
In Broadway.

Mill City, Or., May 21.—Fire broke  
out last night in the second story of  
Gerlach's poolroom, in the old Odd  
Fellows' building, and before the fire  
could be checked it had burned the  
entire business street on the Linn  
county side of the river. The loss is  
estimated at \$10,000, as follows:

New I. O. O. F. building, \$6,000, in-  
surance \$3500; J. L. Weaver grocery  
store, damage to stock \$2000, covered  
by insurance; old I. O. O. F. building,  
\$1000, insured; Patterson's livery  
barn and dwelling, \$500, no insurance;  
Kulchaska's shoe and second-hand  
store, \$500, insured.

Practically everything was carried  
out of all buildings and is in the street  
this morning, with no place to which  
to move it.

Heroic efforts were made by the  
volunteer fire brigade to save the new  
I. O. O. F. building, but the flames  
could not be checked. Only one stream  
of water was available on account of  
the distance from the hydrants. The  
cause of the fire is unknown.

New Road Begins  
Construction Work

Portland & Oregon City Line Has All  
But Mile of Right of Way to Viola,  
in Clackamas County.

Right of way from the city limits of  
Portland to Viola, in Clackamas county,  
except a short stretch of a mile,  
has been secured by the Portland &  
Oregon City Railroad company and  
construction began early this week ac-  
cording to President Stephen Carver  
today.

"We have a small crew of men work-  
ing near Clackamas station now and  
will add to this soon," he said. "With-  
in four months we expect to have 10  
miles of line finished and ready for  
operation between Clackamas and  
Stone, our first terminal."

"We have secured virtually all our  
right of way to Viola save a small  
strip that probably will have to be  
condemned. In securing this we found  
little or no opposition. In fact, many  
of the ranchers, recognizing the ad-  
vantages of a new line, gave us right  
of way."

Viola is approximately 25 miles from  
Portland. The proposed route of the  
electric road, which will be broad  
gauge, runs from the North Bank  
depot, down Flanders to Fourth, up  
Fourth to Madison, across the Madison  
street bridge, through Bellwood, Mil-  
waukie, Clackamas, Stone, Logan to  
Viola, the terminus. The Oregon City  
branch of the line will join the main  
road near Clackamas.

The proposed route would extend in-  
to a rich portion of the city, and  
midway between the proposed Clacka-  
mas Southern and the P. R. L. & P.  
company's Cazadero line.

At the present time the company's  
entrance into Portland is blocked by a  
referendum invoked against the fran-  
chise granted last year by the city and  
the matter is now being fought out in  
the courts.

County Committees  
Meet to Organize

Democrats and Progressives Choose  
Permanent Officers; Republicans De-  
fer Action for Two Weeks.

The newly elected county central  
committee of the Democratic, Republi-  
can and Progressive parties held meet-  
ings last night for the purpose of per-  
fecting permanent organization. The  
Republicans, however, deferred perma-  
nent organization until Monday night,  
and contented themselves with choos-  
ing temporary officers.

For the Democrats, meeting at the  
commercial club, George H. Watson  
was made the permanent chairman, vice  
H. B. Van Duzer, who called the  
meeting to order. George H. Lee was  
made secretary. An only about half of  
the 325 committee members present,  
having had no notice of election from  
the county clerk, election of a state  
committeesman was deferred for two  
weeks.

Meeting in the Progressive head-  
quarters at the Oregon hotel, County  
chairman T. A. Sweeney was reelected  
to succeed himself, while Oliver M.  
Hickey was chosen as secretary. Dr.  
Levi W. Myers was made member of  
the state central committee for Multi-  
nominal county.

The Republican committeemen chose  
O. A. Neal temporary chairman by a  
vote of 110 to 45 for John L. Day.  
David N. Mosesohn was elected sec-  
retary. A number of the committeemen  
urged party harmony. Robert C.  
Wright, retiring county chairman, dis-  
tributed the credentials for the county  
clerk.

Annual Meetings

The annual meetings of the bankers'  
associations of three states will be  
visited by A. L. Tucker, cashier of the  
Lumbermen National bank, who is  
planning to start in a short time on an  
extensive investigative tour of the  
three northwestern states.

Then a delegation from the two states  
will go by special car to Twin Falls,  
Idaho, to attend the convention of  
 Idaho bankers. Then a number of the  
party, including Mr. Tucker, will re-  
turn to Portland and go to Medford to  
attend the Oregon meeting, June 15  
and 16.
