

**MONTHLY DINNER OF THE SOCIAL WORKERS PROVES BIG SUCCESS**

Covers Laid for 75 Representing Philanthropic Agencies of the City.

**MANY MATTERS DISCUSSED**

Resolution Passed Asking That Gipsy Smith Auditorium Be Not Torn Down Now.

The fourth monthly dinner of the Social Workers' club was held at the Hazelwood Friday evening. Covers were laid for 75 workers representing 50 of Portland's philanthropic agencies. Miss Valentine Prichard, superintendent of the People's Institute, presided and introduced the speakers with fitting remarks on the various phases of social service.

John Truesler Jr., field agent for the Boys and Girls Aid society, spoke on the "Trained Worker." Dr. William F. Ogburn of Reed college gave a resume of the three conferences on human welfare which have recently been held in the northwest, the Academy of Science, in Seattle; the Commonwealth conference in Eugene and the Reed college 1912 conference. He emphasized the fact that all three meetings laid special stress on the responsibility of society for social ills in contrast to the older view that the individual was himself the cause.

Isaac Swett outlined the problem of unemployment in Portland and gave suggestions as to how to deal with it next winter. The committee appointed at the recent session of the Oregon Congress of Charities and Corrections to nominate officers for the coming year reported as follows: President, A. L. Mills; first vice president, V. R. Manning; second vice president, Dr. P. L. Campbell; third vice president, Mrs. Clara Walden; secretary, Mrs. R. Trumbull; treasurer, W. T. Gardner; directors, Miss Valentine Prichard, Rabbi Jonah B. Wise, Father E. V. O'Hara, Dr. W. T. Foster, Mrs. Sarah A. Evans, Mrs. Arden.

A resolution was passed asking that the Gipsy Smith auditorium not be torn down until a better place be found for caring for the unemployed next winter. The Associated Charities is working on a plan for a municipal lodging house and will report the result of their survey to the city council a few days. It was voted to make the Associated Charities a central registry office for all cases of dependency and delinquency, both of children and adults, in order to facilitate all matters of investigation and work and obviate the overlapping of services. A committee was appointed to investigate the various social service agencies and make up a list of reliable ones to be submitted to business men who are now at a loss to know where to call for certain services.

**Patent Cattle Food Asked for in Bid**

Portland Millers Object to Government Specifications and They Are Changed by Canal Commission.

(Washington Bureau of the Journal.) Washington, June 6.—On a representation of Senator Chamberlain, Chief Clerk of the committee on canal affairs has ordered new bids called for for canal supplies. Objection was made that the term "supreme limited tenders" in a proprietary contract between the millers said supreme was the name of a proprietary cattle food, which only one firm could furnish.

**Mason's Bid Accepted.**

Washington, June 6.—Secretary of the Interior Lane has authorized the reclamation service to accept the proposal of W. M. Mason of Klamath Falls for construction of the Lost River diversion channel of the Klamath Falls irrigation project. Mason's bid was \$19,923.59. The contract provides for excavation of a total of 11,500 cubic yards of material.

**Revenue Cutter for Astoria.**

Washington, June 6.—The department of commerce has requested the Senate Chamberlain that it has requested the treasury department to detail a revenue cutter to patrol the course of the regatta at Astoria, July 2 and 3.

Washington, June 5.—Secretary of the Treasury McAdoo has awarded the contract for a new terrazzo floor for the public building at Portland to Edward Barrett, Portland, at \$2976.
