DOCK COMMISSION OFFERS COOPERAGE COMPANY LEASE

Low Rate Given on Condition That Plant Employ at Least 200 Men.

WOULD ROADWAY Commission Willing to Assist St. Johns in Building From Drydock to Plant; Want Dredger.

If the Western Cooperage company is sincere in its promises to employ from 200 to 400 men at the new plant near the municipal drydock, the Port of Portland commission will lease it the property needed near the dock at rate of 5 per cent on the appraised value of the land. This decision was reached by the commission at the regular meeting yesterday and is now up to the company for acceptance. The lease will be made to stipulate that the company must employ at least 200 men all the time or forfeit their lease.

The commission also promised to help"the city of St. Johns in building a roadway from the drydock and cooperage plant up to Willamette boulevard if plans were satisfactory and promised the Port of Astoria that they could count on the tugboats Oneonta and Wallula for fireboats in case of fire at Astoria again. The Portland public drydock commission requested the use of the dredger Portland for a short time about August 1 for work at the new municipal dock No. 1, but owing to the time being during the height of the digging season in the harbor the request was refused.
