Sent by the Oregon Conservation ommission to make a thorough and mpartial investigation of conditions on the Umatilla irrigation project, Charles D. Mahaffie, assistant secretary of the commission, has just reported to Joseph N. Teal, chairman, that there is no reason for discourage-

Recent assertions that the soil is infertile and that it is impossible for farmers to make a livelihood on the tract under reclamation led to the investigation. The report concludes:

"It seems to me that the crops growing on this land at the present time disprove as conclusively as is possible the allegation that the land is, to any considerable extent, infertile, and the experience, both here as elsewhere, is that as the land is cultivated and crops are grown on it from year to year it will become more fertile.

"The farmers on the project are for the most part doing well and it is doubtful if there is a less percentage of failures or cases where men are having extreme difficulty in making ends

meet in any section of the state.
