

ANTIQUATED ENGINE BRINGS BACK DAYS OF THE PAST

Pioneers Recall Days of Long Ago; Pony Express One Feature.

PRAIRIE SCHOONER THERE

Transportation Club Display in Big Parade Told Magic Story of Early Days in Oregon.

Pioneers who stood at the curb's edge Friday and saw passing by the display of the Portland Transportation club, were taken back in fancy to the early days in Oregon, when travel was not featured by gigantic locomotives and palatial observation cars.

They saw the first mode of all in the transportation of freight—the canoe roughly hewn by the Indians out of a hollow log in which they carried their persons and goods over the reaches of the upper Columbia. This canoe was loaned to the club by the old Fort Dalles Historical society at The Dalles.

Following this came the pony express, with the mounted messenger conveyed by a party of plainmen. Realistic touches were given by the pseudo-firing of ancient rifles back and forth by the Indians in the canoe ahead and the white men of the express.

Ox Team Feature.
Came next the ox team pulling the covered wagon in which so many of the forebears of this generation in Oregon crossed the plains. One Ezra Meeker, one of the relics of this form of travel who still boasts of his record in transcontinental ox trips, was in charge and made an interesting spectacle.

Possibly of most historic interest of all, however, was the final float on which was mounted the identical locomotive that pulled the first real train over the rails in Oregon. This was manned with engineer and fireman and was decorated with flowers. Yet beneath its idyllic covering could be seen the ancient metal, the lines, so uncouth to modern eyes, that made the object in its day a marvel of advancement.

The locomotive, barely 12 feet long, and resembling the one first built by Stephenson, was made in San Francisco in 1862 and brought to Portland by boat the following year.

Moved to Cello.
It was placed in commission from the lower to the upper Cascades on the Portage railroad in April of 1863. After a year or so this proved too small an engine to take care of the traffic and it was moved up to the Cello Portage.

The first engineer was Theodore A. Goffe, who died many years ago. Two of the women who made the first trip were Mrs. L. F. Cartee, wife of a former government surveyor-general, and Mrs. Jennie Felling, who still lives at Fendleton.

After it had outlived its usefulness, the locomotive was presented to the state of Oregon and it was one of the interesting exhibits at the Lewis and Clark exposition, set alongside one of the modern 180,000 pound engines. At the close of the exposition, George H. Hines, secretary of the Historical society, had it placed in the O.-W. R. & N. roundhouse at Albina, where it will be kept until a permanent place can be found for it.

Indian Dugout Paddles.
The whole Transportation club exhibit had historical features, particularly one of the paddles used on the Indian dugout.

This paddle was found on the beach at Puget Sound and had been used by Indians from the Queen Charlotte Sound country. These Indians in 1857 swooped down upon Whidbey's island, where they killed Colonel Isaac N. Ebey. This paddle was found next day by Edward Chamberlain, who later presented it to the Oregon Historical society. The paddle is made of yew, such as was used by all the coast Indians to make their bows before the advent of firearms.

Three rifles used in the parade were loaned by Mr. Hines to the club for the day. These were of the type brought across the plains in the early forties. They are of the "Kentucky" type, with home-made stocks which cover the whole barrel.

COUNTY COURT NEWS

Randolph Hartley of Portland was allowed \$25 indemnity for a cow slaughtered by him in the city, the county paying half and the state to pay the remainder.

County Clerk Coffey was directed to publish notices of the proposed Riverside Drive improvement on the city streets for five consecutive weeks.

The foreman of each bridge and the superintendent of repairs were ordered to make all repairs outside of street-car traffic hours when possible and to give the Portland Railway, Light & Power company notice of prospective delays that the company may arrange for rerouting cars affected.

Mrs. Nora Bicknell, through Chester G. Murphy, her attorney, petitioned the board for lease of one year on space under the west end of the Morrison bridge, with exclusive mooring privileges after July 15. J. D. Mitchell, the present lessee, was notified of the petition. The space rents for \$5 a month. Mrs. Bicknell operates the Favorite bathhouse, adjoining the bridge.

D. G. Tomasini was directed to deliver 25 or 30 chairs to the city for the Visiting Nurse association for use at the milk station to be established opposite the city hall this summer.

Auditor Martin was directed to send a bill for \$200 to the O.-W. R. & N. company for electricity furnished for heat for the company's watchman on the railroad bridge.

Roadmaster Yeon, reporting on communications regarding hard surface specifications for county roads, said that under the law it is mandatory that the material for paving be selected before proceedings can be started, and that competition cannot be allowed. The report was ordered filed.

District Attorney Evans reported the investigation of the collision of the steamship Yucatan of the North Pacific Steamship company with the cruiser Boston indicates that the master of the Yucatan was at fault, & cause at the time he had no harbor pilot's license and no local pilot on board. He said he did not see that the county is liable.
