Chicago Unveils a Statue of Goethe

One Hundred German Societies Participate in Program of Speeches and Music at Lincoln Park.

Chicago, Ill., June 13 .- A statue of the German poet, Goethe, a gift to the city from the Goethe society of Chicago, was unveiled in Lincoln park today with interesting exercises. One hundred German societies of Chicago and vicinity participated in the pro-gram, which consisted of speeches, recitations and music.

The statue is of bronze and is 18 feet in height. It was executed at Munich by Professor Herman Hahn, who was present at the unveiling. The figure of the poet stands on a granite base. On the front of the base appears Goethe's mask. Goethe is pictured as a powerful, ideal figure, standing with one foot raised on a rock. An eagle is perched on the knee.


