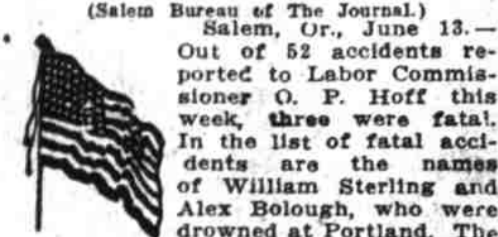


THREE ACCIDENTAL DEATHS IN OREGON REPORTED IN WEEK

Drowning of Sterling and Bolough Included in Mishaps Reported.

FIFTY-TWO IS THE TOTAL

W. F. Conman Killed at Albina in Connection With Railroad Work.

English Society Asks Prime Minister to Name a Commission to Report on the Whole Question.

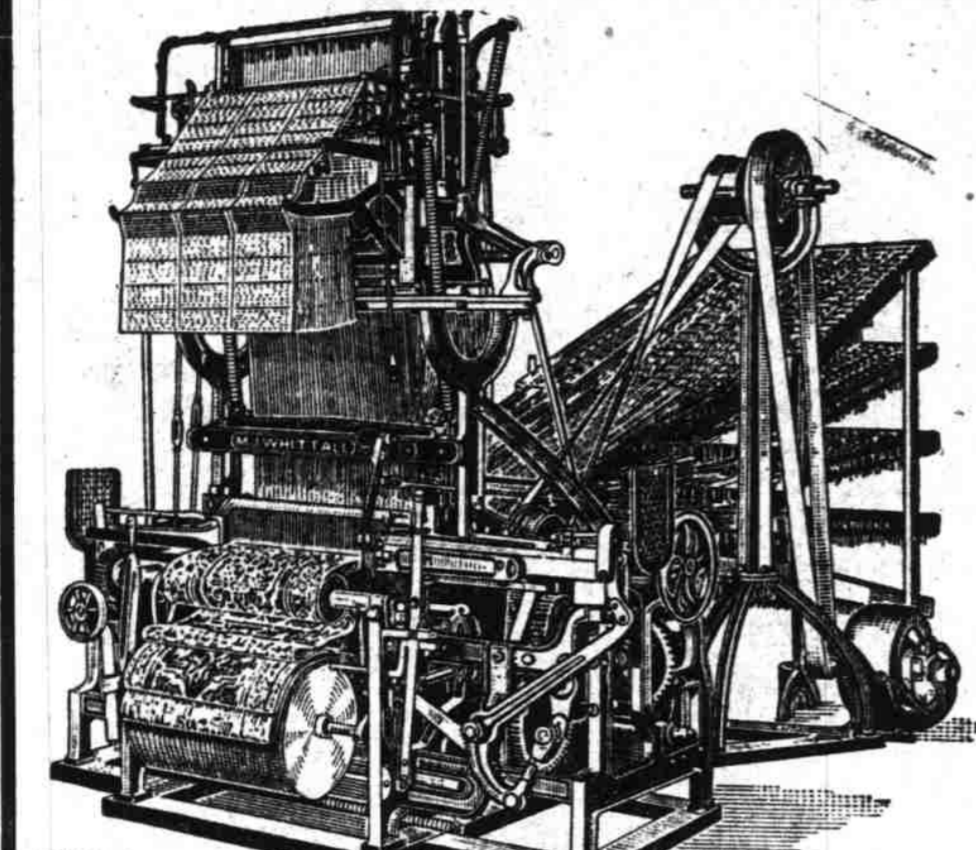
