Inverness, Scotland, June 19.—News was anxiously awaited here today of the result of the search of the debris of a train wrecked Thursday night 23 miles south of Inverness, with the loss, it was feared, of 15 lives. The coaches crashed through a culvert. Three corpses had been recovered and 12 other persons were reported missing. The known dead were all women. The wreck was in the center of a swift stream, making rescue work slow and very difficult.

Candidate Promises Big Tax Reduction

Archibald Weinstein of Failing School Not in Race for Junior City Commissioner—Announces His Platform.

"If elected, I will administer the city's affairs as I would my own."

With this alluring promise, and another plank in his platform taking a drastic stand for the reduction of the present high tax rate, Archibald Weinstein, aged 32, of the Failing school, has launched a cyclonic campaign for commissioner in the junior government election. There are now 14 candidates in the field for the seven junior government offices to be filled, and other nominations will be made up to and including Wednesday. Fully 40 candidates are being groomed for the big campaign. After school hours every day campaign headquarters at 918 Yeon building fairly swarms with excited young politicians. Votes are 1 cent each. The proceeds of the election, which will close Saturday, July 11, will be applied upon the annual payment that is about due upon the installment mortgage on the Newsboys' home at First and Hall streets. George L. Baker, Doris E. Keasey and Alex Rae, trustees of the institution, are managing the campaign.

AGED GEOLOGIST IS TO RISK LIFE INSPECTING MT. LASSEN'S CRATER

"I Am Going Clear to Top at All Hazards," Says Veteran Climber.

TO MAKE OFFICIAL REPORT

Professor J. B. Diller to Spend Several Days Investigating Smoking Mountain in California.

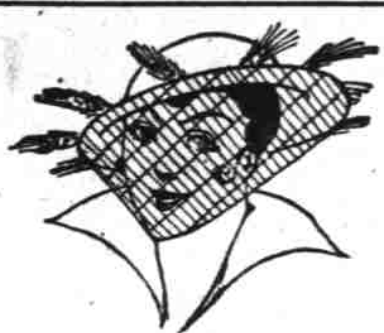
Redding, Cal., June 19.—Bound for the summit of Mount Lassen, no matter what the risks, Professor J. B. Diller, the geological expert, left here today to make a thorough inspection of the smoking crater on the great peak's slope, preliminary to a report to the United States geological survey and to the issuance of a statement to the press concerning the result of his observations.

The professor visited the mountain first in 1883, and he ascended it several times since. "This trip is perilous," he commented before leaving here, as he glanced up at the blackened cone and noted the wisps of steam arising from it, "and I'm an old man now—not the climber I was in '83—but I'm going clear to the top at all hazards."

The aged geologist also asked through the United Press that all persons who have taken photographs of eruptions send copies to him at Redding, giving their names, addresses and the exact time and places from which the photographs were snapped, for publication in connection with the geological survey's report.

Professor Diller will camp at Manzanita lake, five miles from the crater, and spend several days in his investigations. The volcano was quiet today.
