Floods Figure in Suit.—The floods of March, 1913, were the basis of the defense of the Relson Machinery company to the suit of Charles Gardner for \$478.50 for loss on a contract, and the jury which heard the case in Circuit Judge Kavanagh's court returned a verdict for the company. Gardner contracted for a wood saw from the company and began to take orders. The company failed to deliver the saw, on the ground that the floods kept the factory from sending the saw. Gardner alleged that the saw was to have been shipped from Seattle, and the floods had no effect on traffic in that direction.
