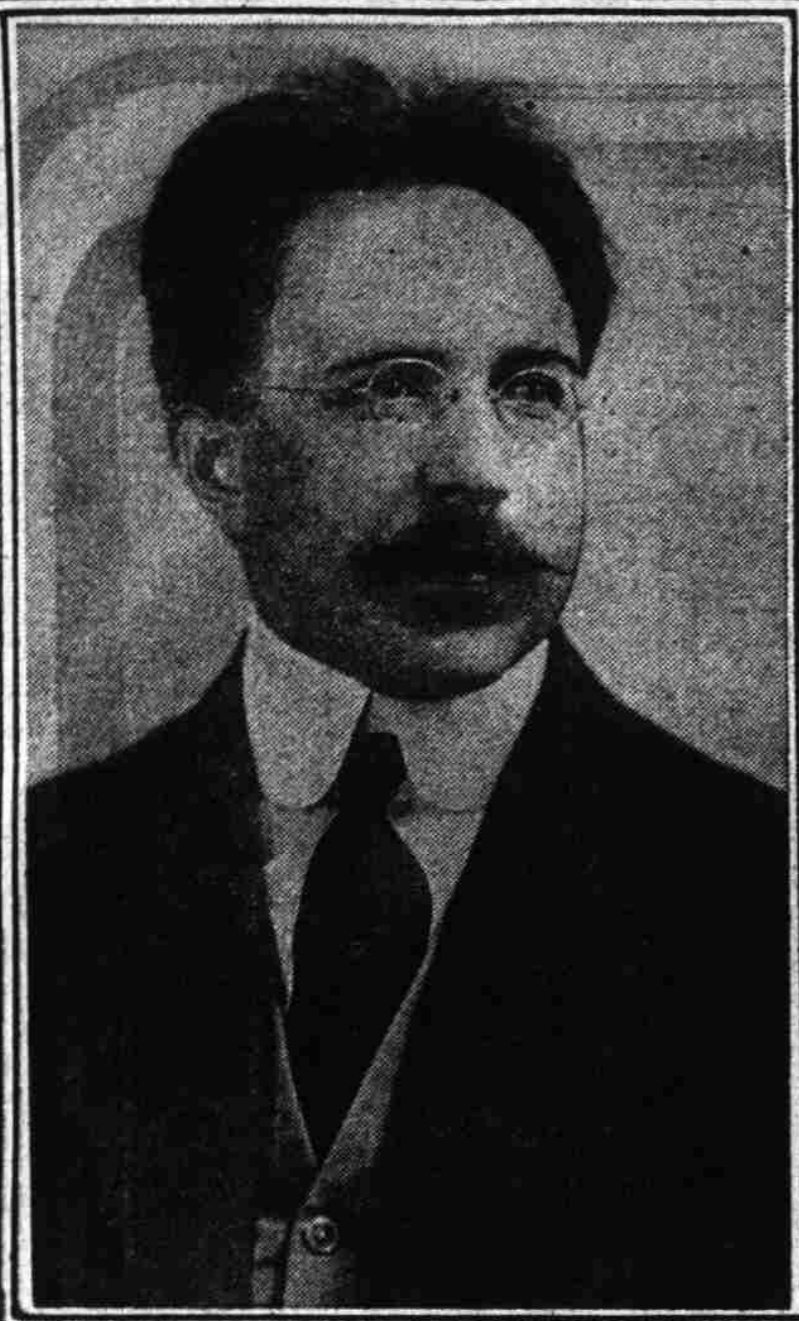
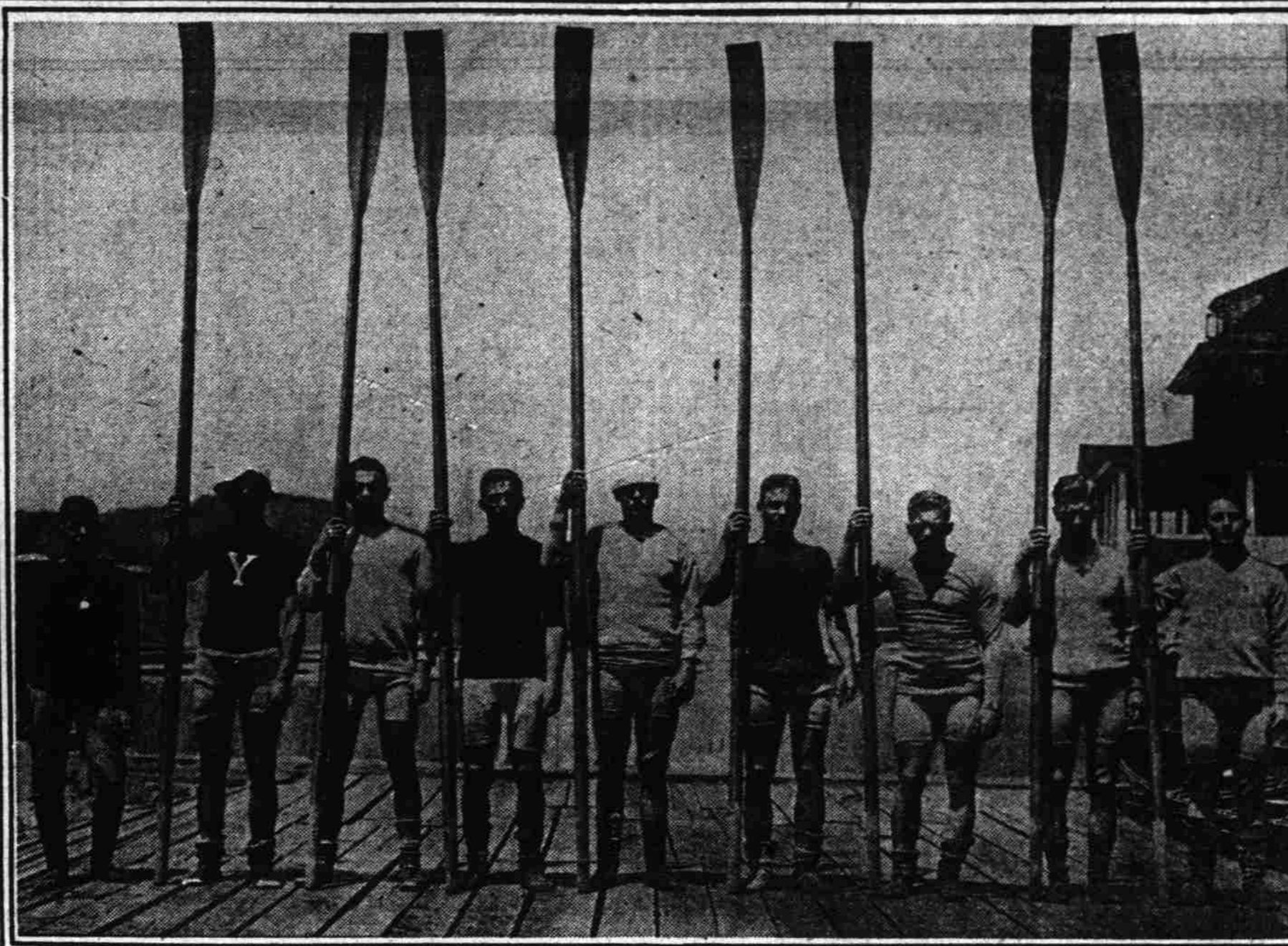


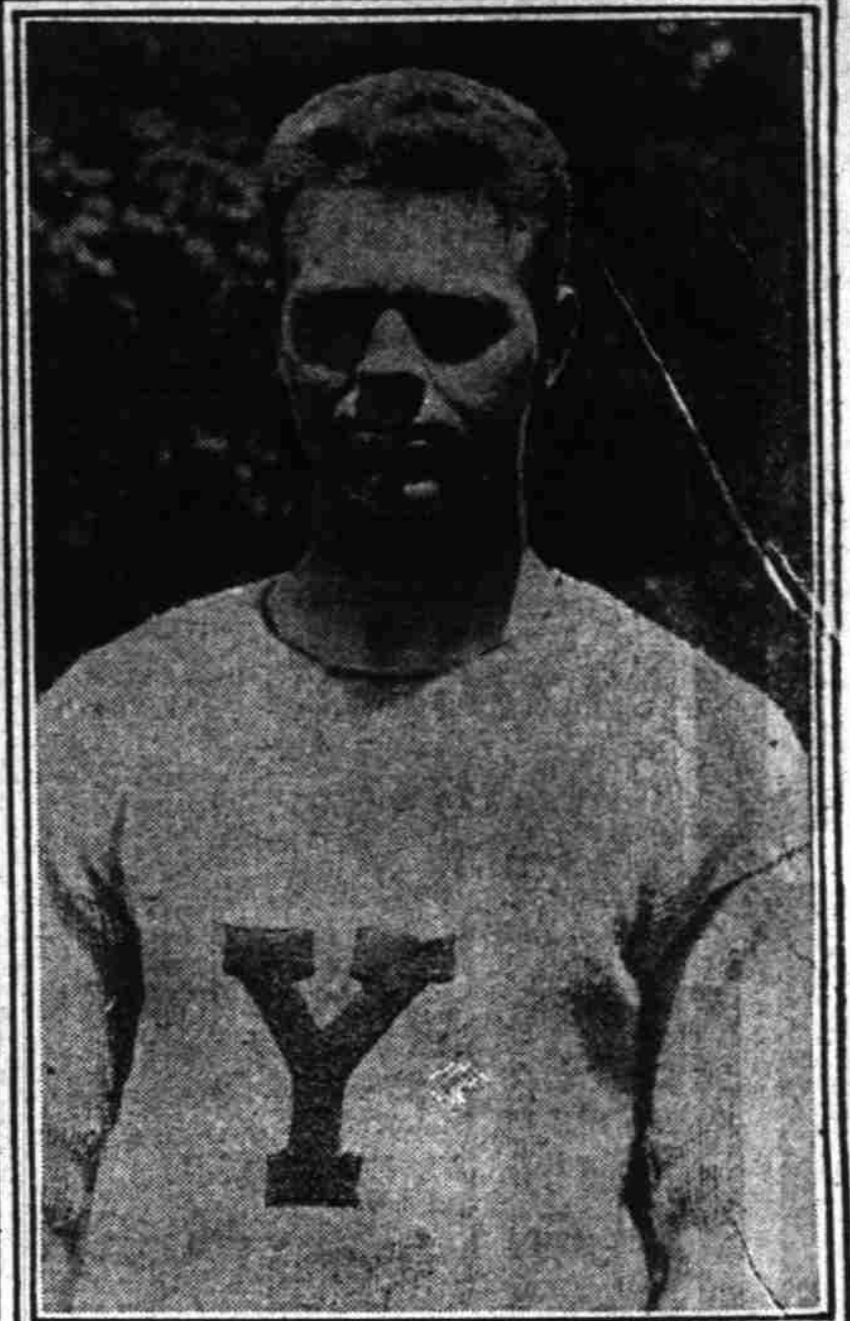

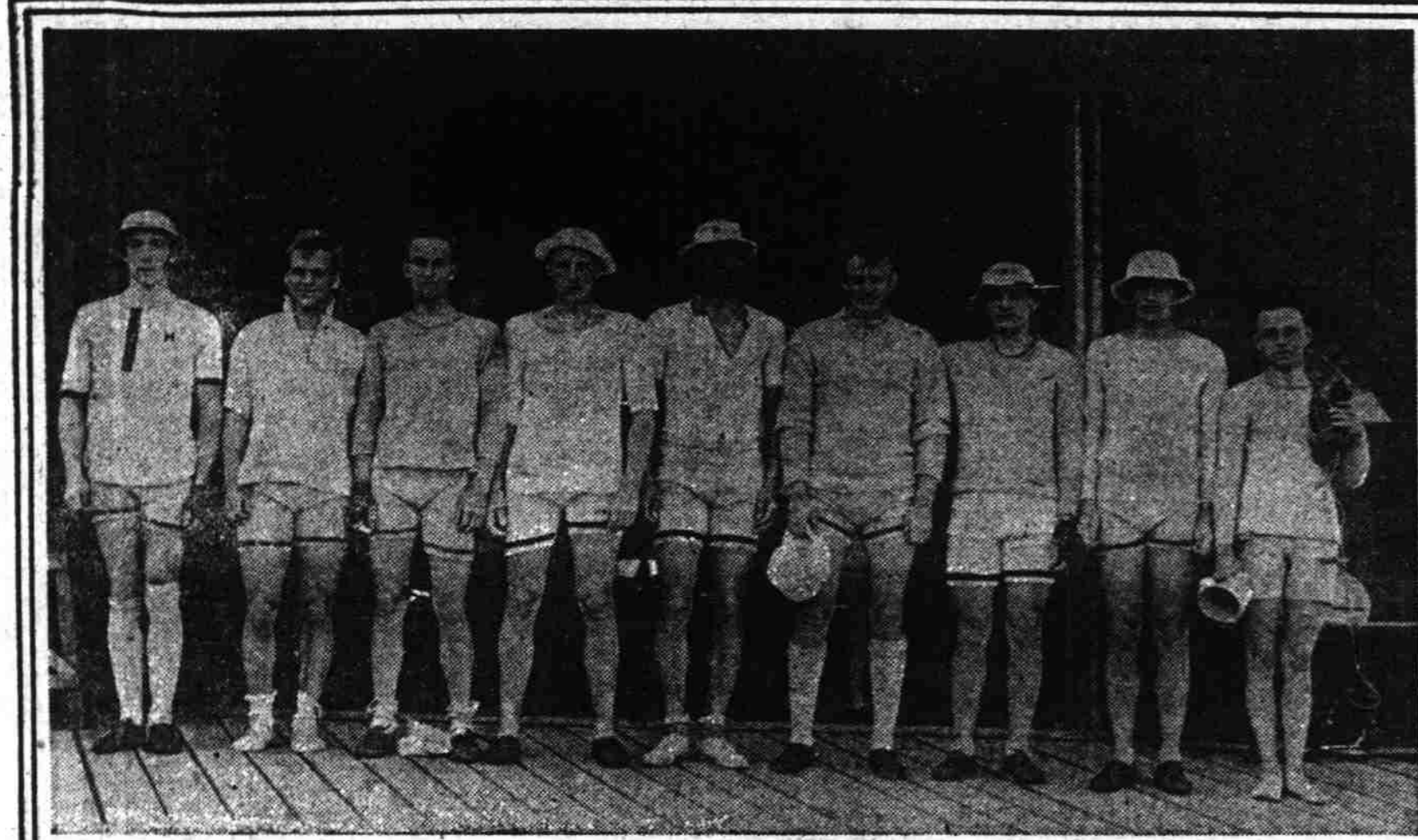
CARRANZA'S FOREIGN MINISTER

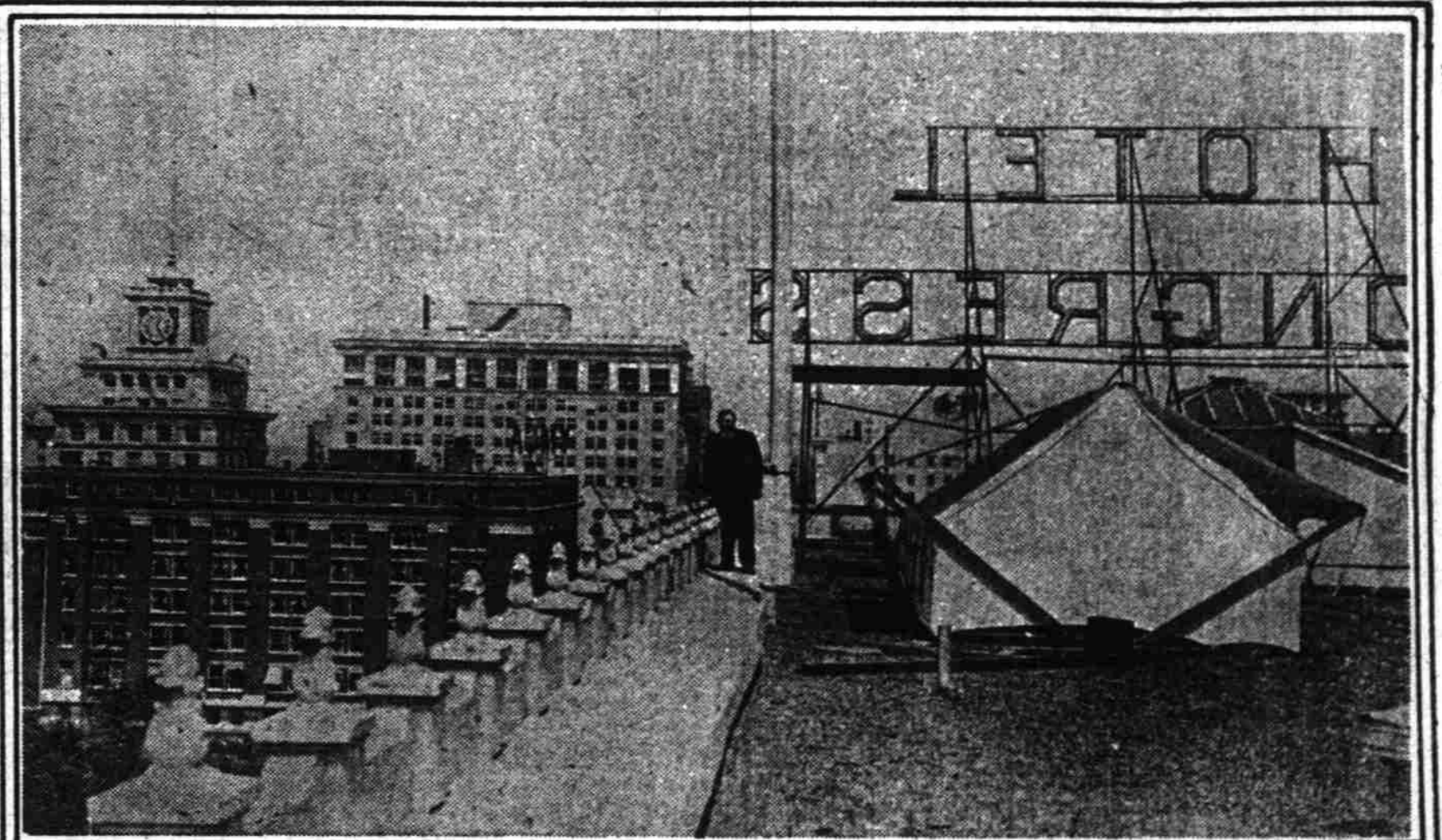
YALE OARSMEN PHOTOGRAPHED AT THE END OF A STRENUOUS TRAINING PERIOD
