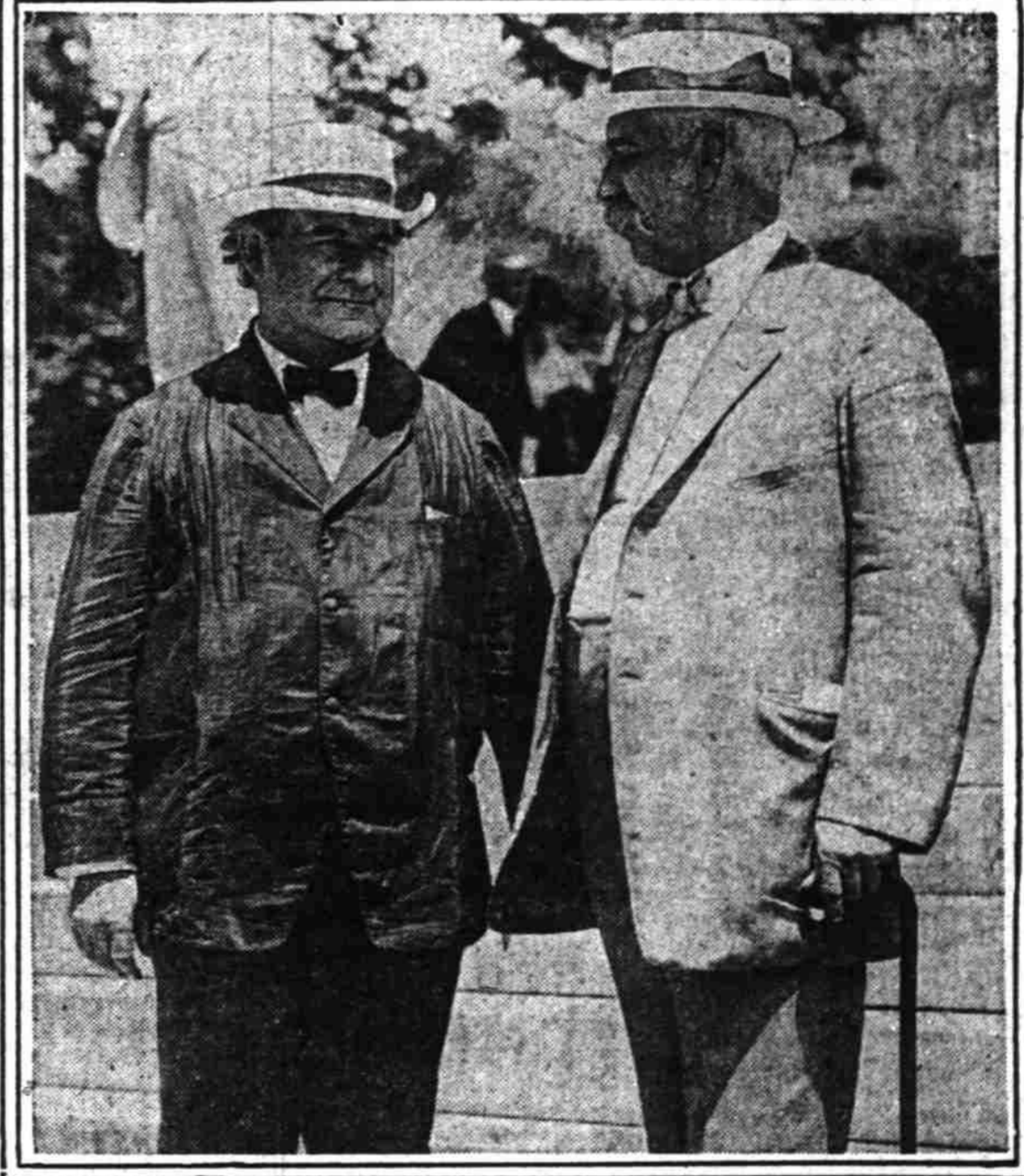
NEW TURKISH AMBASSADOR TO THE U. S.

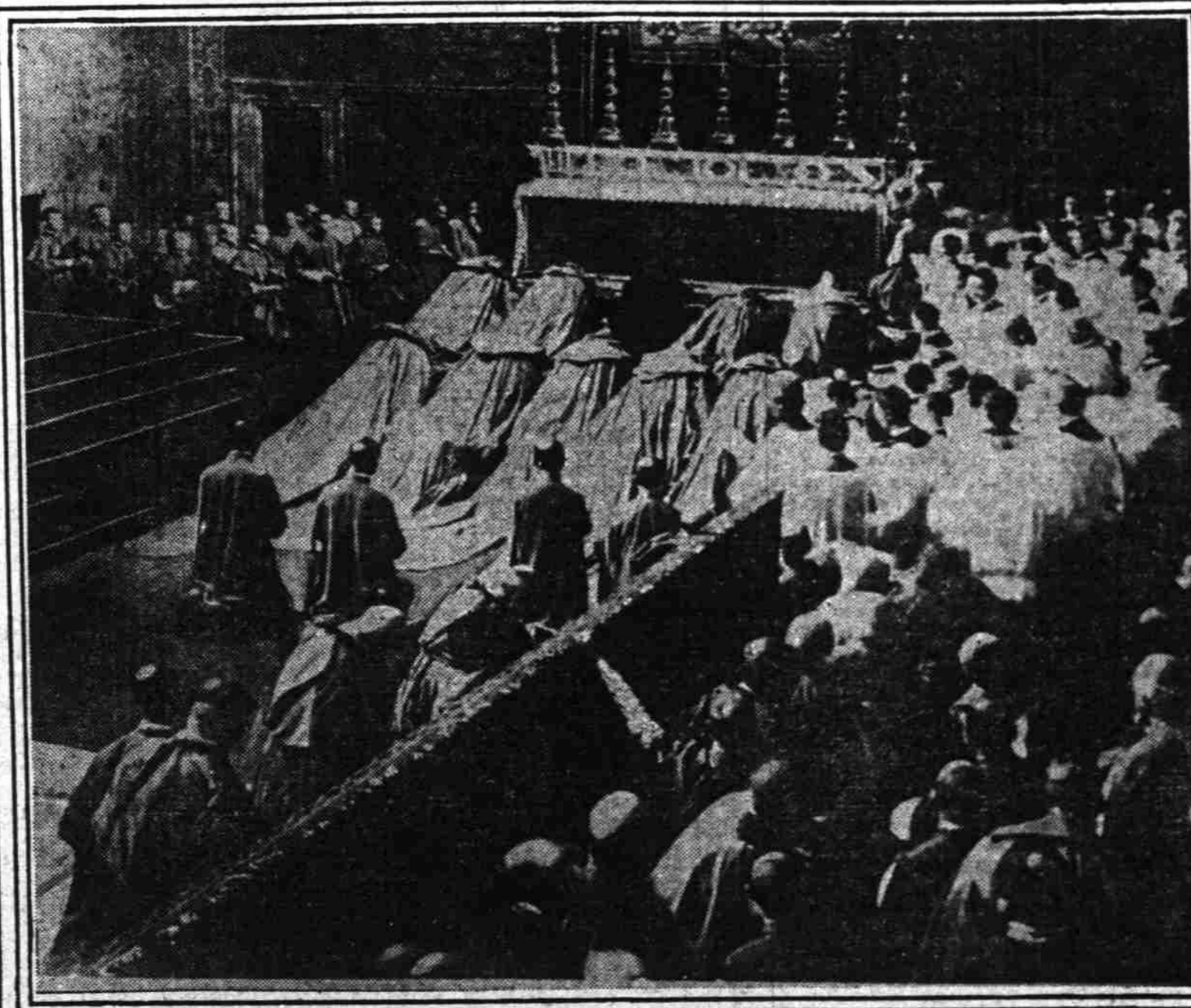
VENUS AND THE THREE GRACES AT COLLEGE PAGEANT

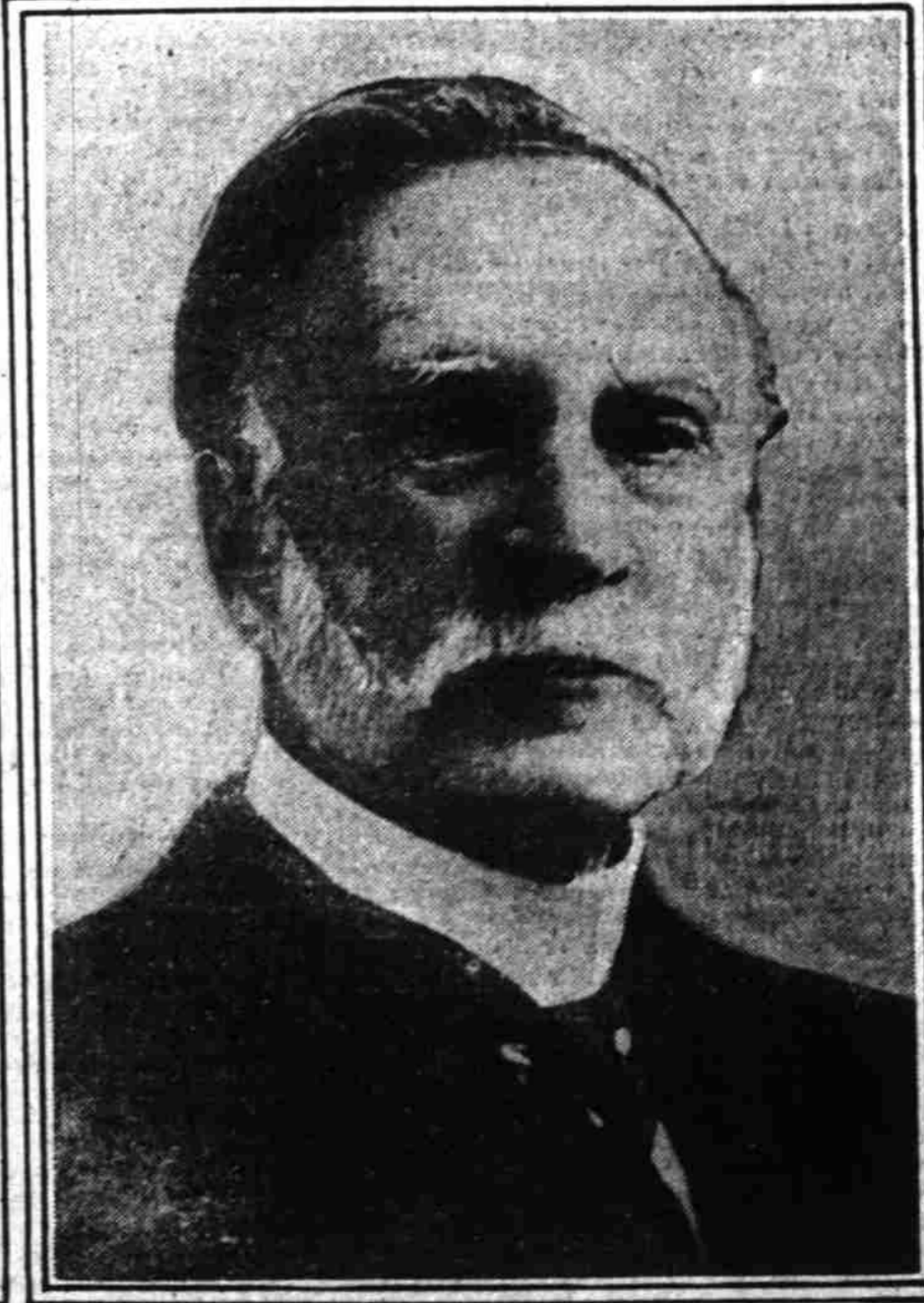
U. S. VICE CONSUL SILLIMAN AND SECRETARY BRYAN
