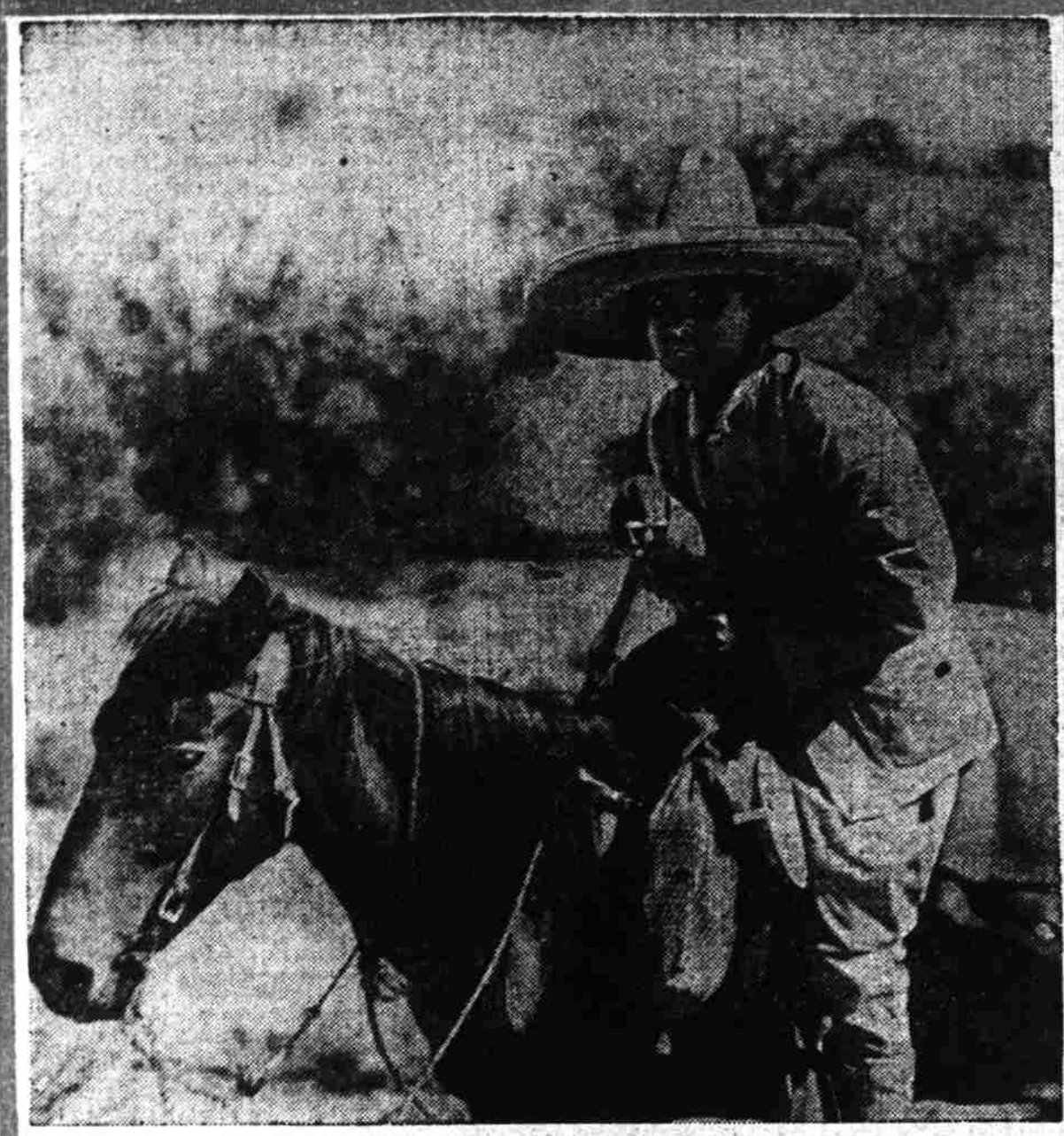

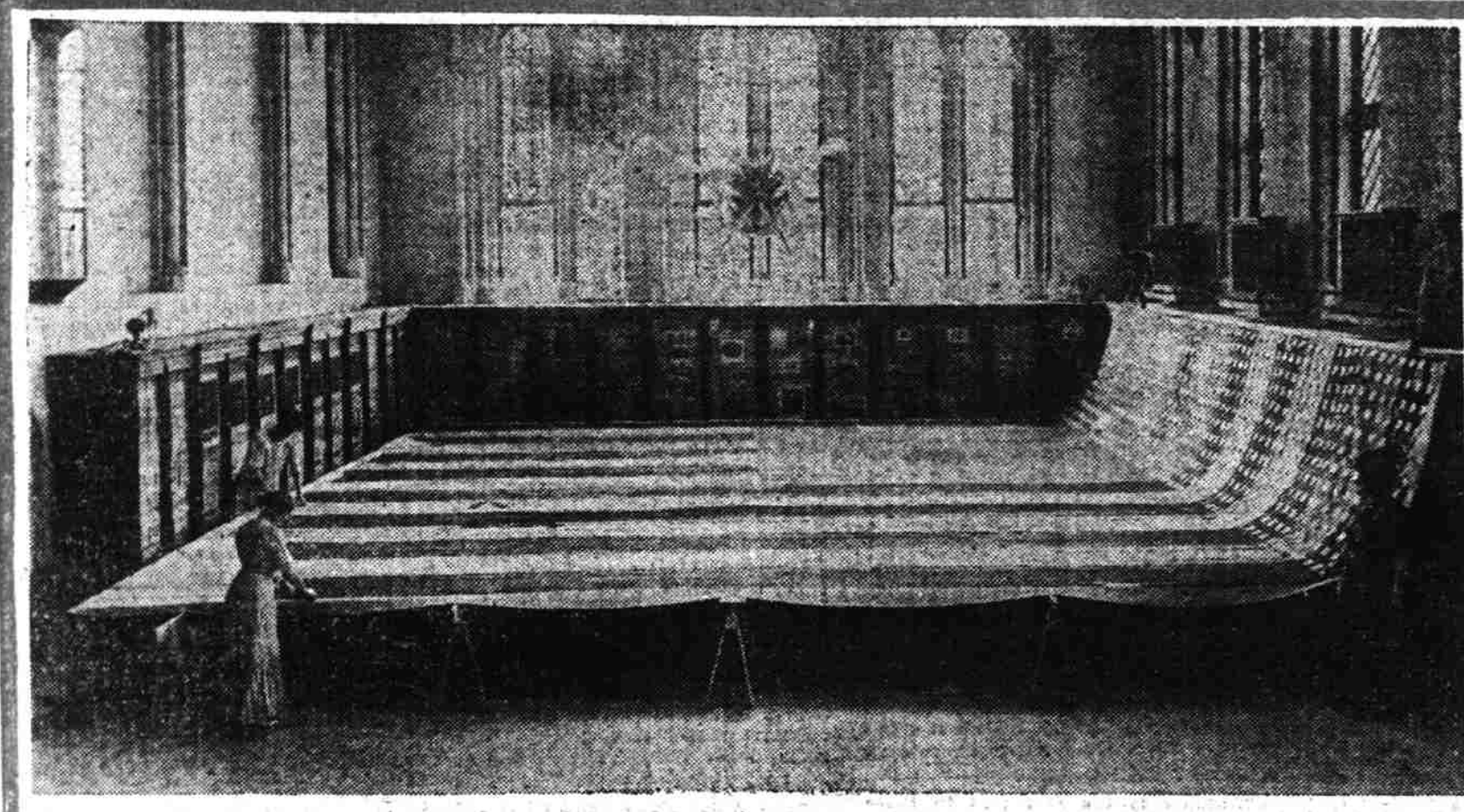


MRS. ELVIRA GUTERIEZ, THE JOAN OF ARC OF NORTHERN MEXICO

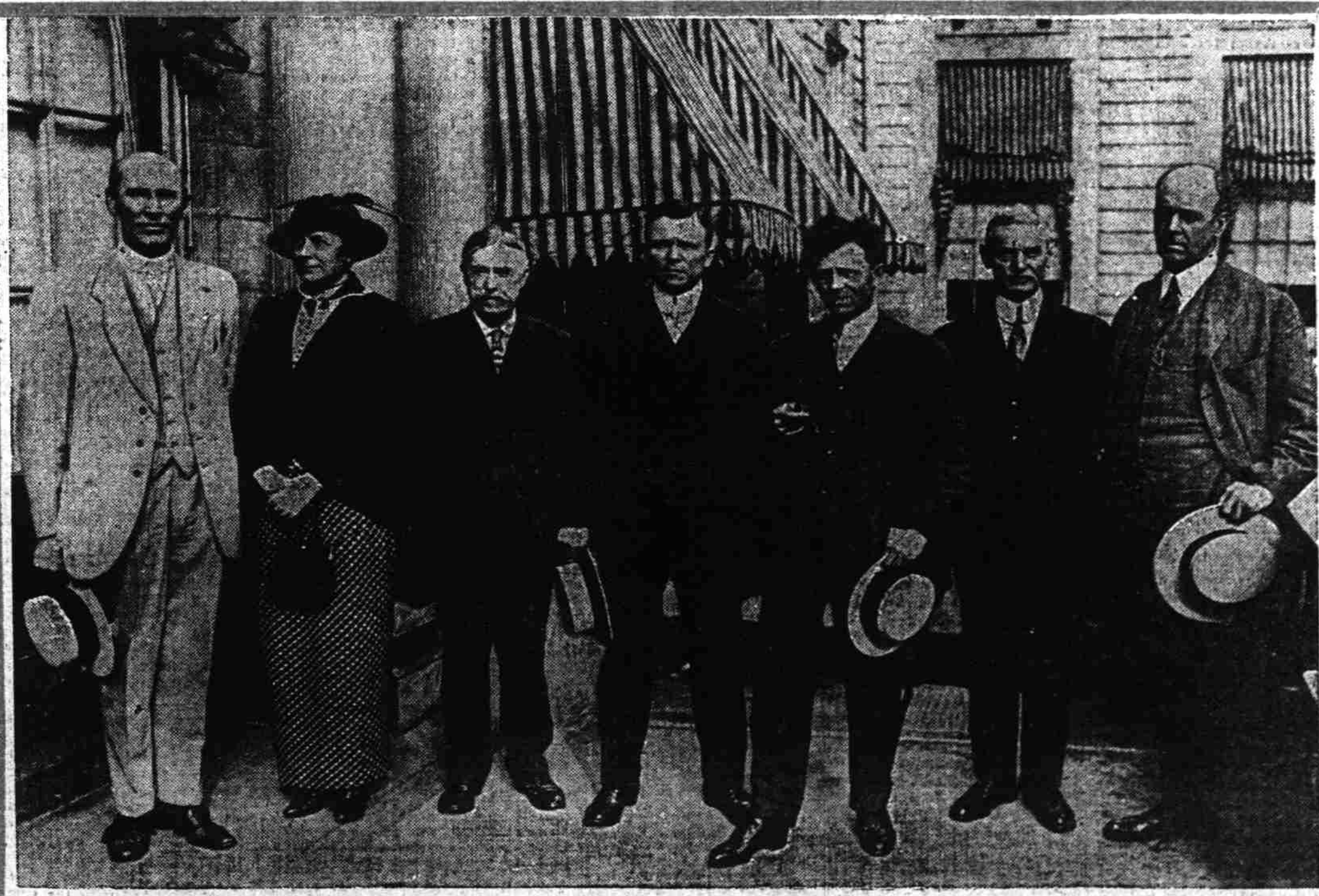
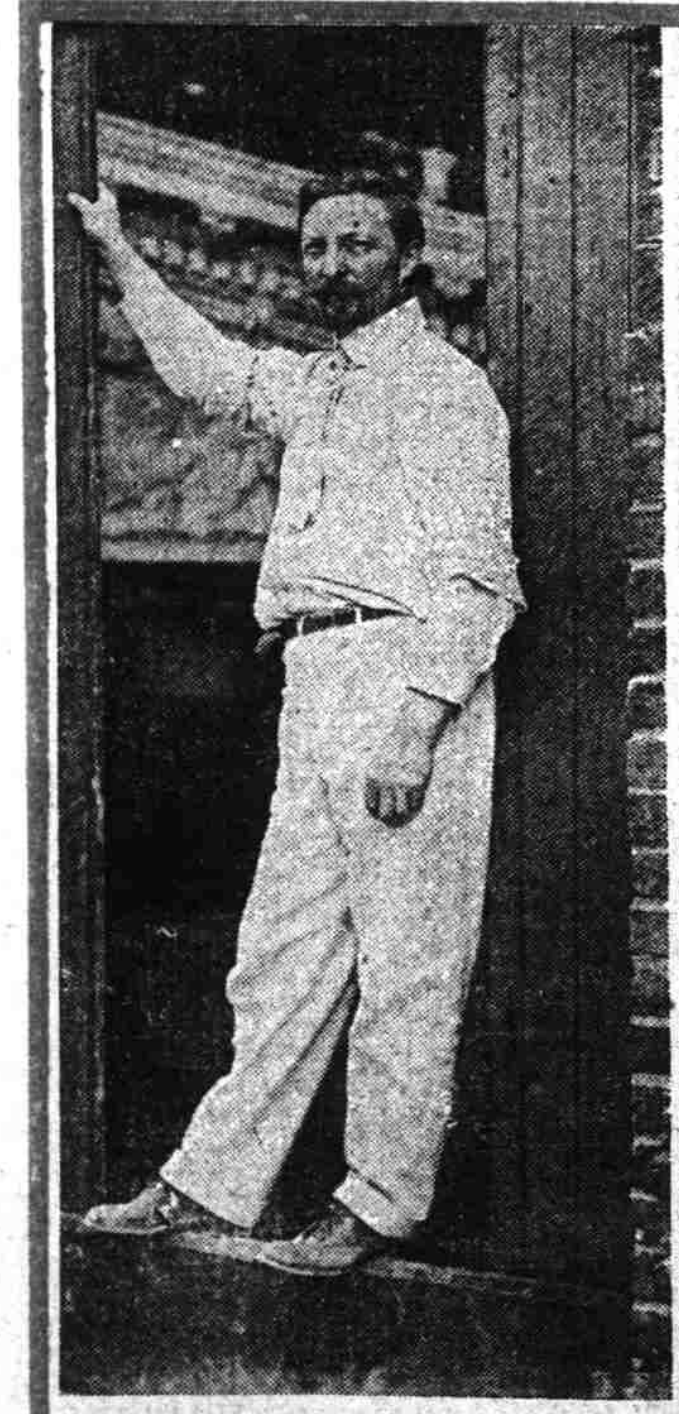


THE ORIGINAL "STAR SPANGLED BANNER" NOW BEING RESTORED IN NATIONAL MUSEUM
