

HINDUS EXHORTED TO

RETURN TO INDIA AND RISE AGAINST BRITAIN

Mayor Calls Meeting.
JAPANESE BOAT HELPLESS

Ship Weigh Anchor at Vancouver, B. C., for Return to Orient.

(United Press Lashed Wire.)

Vancouver, B. C., June 23.—To the chanting of Sikh hymns, with an accompaniment of weird music from strange Hindu instruments, was opened a public meeting, attended by 800 Hindus and 200 white men, yesterday afternoon in Dornoch hall, at which resolutions protesting that neither food nor water is permitted to the Hindus detained on board the Kamagata Maru were introduced. Copies of the resolutions were sent to the British Borden and the secretary of state for India. The Hindu speakers, poured forth tirades in their native tongue against the immigration officials, the Canadian government and the Canadian people.

One speaker, in a burst of eloquence,

warned the Japanese training ships now in Vancouver harbor not to interfere with the Hindus.

Sedition Is Preached.

Sedition and treason were openly and frankly preached.

The gravest aspect of the meeting was the introduction into the Hindu meeting of a white Socialist of ex-

The Hindu speakers who followed him were priests of Sikh Temple, Ra-
