

BOYS LEAVE ON TRIP TO Y. M. C. A. CAMP NEAR MT. ST. HELENS

More Than Score of Lads
Depart on Summer Outing
at Spirit Lake.

FIELD MEETS PLANNED

Prizes Will Be Given Winners in Various Outdoor Sports and Contests in Mountains.

More than a score of boys started this morning for the Y. M. C. A. camp at Spirit Lake, near the foot of Mt. St. Helens.

"This is the largest number we have ever taken in on our first trip," said J. C. Meehan, who is in charge of the party.

"The boys pay \$5 a week, which covers all expense, and most of them stay three or four weeks. The boys are required to provide themselves with a knapsack, blue flannel shirt, khaki trousers, heavy shoes, two suits of underwear, plenty of socks and a pair of blankets.

A 47-mile "hike." "We go from here to Kelso on the steamer Kellogg and there we will take the train to Castle Rock. At Castle Rock we are met by a team, which carries the luggage, while the boys with their knapsacks hike to the camp, a distance of 47 miles. They start on their hike at 4 o'clock tonight and get there Wednesday night.

"We allow each boy to carry 15 pounds of load for each 100 pounds of boy, and one pound additional of load for each additional 10 pounds of boy. For example, a boy weighing 140 pounds is allowed to carry 19 pounds in his knapsack.

"We have two log cabins and a dining pavilion. The cabins are used only in case of rain, as the boys prefer to sleep in the shelter tents we provide. We have a good cook and, though the food is plain, there is plenty of it—and how the boys do enjoy it!

"The boys set up their own shelter tents and make their own beds. Their mattresses and springs are made of fir and hemlock boughs. The camp is a true republic as the boys elect a camp council of five who make the laws. They also elect a governor, a judge, a district attorney, a sheriff and a deputy sheriff. Each day the governor appoints an officer of the day, who inspects the camp and awards an honor flag to the boy whose tent is the neatest and whose bed is made the best.

"The boys fish, swim, go boating, visit the numerous lakes to the northward of our camp and climb Mounts Margaret, Ellnor and St. Helens. A camp leader goes with the boys on all their hikes and also accompanies them when they go swimming in the lake. The camp is administered under an honor system which supplements the self-government plan. The boys are marked on 10 points: health, neatness, promptness, cheerfulness, manners, morals, trustworthiness, achievement, service and industry.

"They are marked on a scale of 10 on each of these points, and the boy that gets a grade of six or more in each of the 10 points is made a camp leader and is awarded the honor emblem, a cap with the Spirit Lake monogram. As we grade closely, a boy has to make good to win this coveted honor. At the end of the season three medals are awarded to the three boys scoring highest as the best all-around fellows in the camp.

Will Hold Field Meets. "E. S. Collins, a warm supporter of the boys' camp and the boys' work, has given us \$20 to purchase prizes to be contested for in three field meets. There will be a lightweight division and a heavyweight division in each of the field meets. The 10 events are of the rope climb, obstacle race, mile run, shot put, broad jump, high jump, pole vault, boat race, diving and swimming.

"If it were fun only that the boys get out of their camp life we would not keep it up. But we find that the boys come back better citizens; we are able to get closer to them and to inspire them with higher ideals in camp than in town."

Work of Commission Far From Complete

E. C. C. Examiner Who Is Here to Conduct Series of Rate Hearings Tells of Task That Confronts.

"It is proving no small task to get the railroads of the country to get the idea of what the Interstate Commerce commission is trying to do," said A. D. Pugh, examiner for the commission, who is here from Washington to conduct a series of hearings on rate matters now in dispute.

"As fast as one principle is established, new ones bob up for adjustment. On the whole, while the commission's work is far from done, things gradually are becoming adjusted."

Mr. Pugh said he believed the roads are willing to abide by whatever rulings are made, though there are still left remnants of the old spirit of "the public be damned."

Removal of discriminations in favor of certain localities and against others, readjustments of rates that cause one city to suffer though others nearby are made to thrive, spectating to what extent the roads can control the routing of traffic and the so-called "gateways" all cause bitter contests between railroads and shippers and railroads and localities.

It is only by the hearing of individual complaints that great transportation principles are established. Mr. Pugh said, and yet cases of the same kind are often so different as to establish other principles.

Mr. Pugh has held hearings in Portland many times, and has taken testimony in dozens of different rate controversies here.

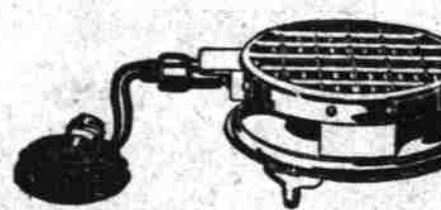
