

WHEN IS A BOSS NOT A BOSS? HERE'S THE AGGRIEVED PERROSE

Pennsylvania Senator Replies to Bitter Attack Made on Him by Colonel Roosevelt.

DIFFERENT YEARS AGO

Says Roosevelt Answered Him in Positive Terms That He Had No Further Presidential Ambitions.

Pittsburg, July 1.—Senator Penrose, who was bitterly attacked by Colonel Roosevelt in his talk here last night, gave out a statement expressing surprise at the colonel's "recently acquired ability to draw the line between a boss and a leader," and asked what he considered his own position had been when he compelled the Republican party to accept Taft as its candidate in 1904. He said in part:

"It is difficult for me to determine just when Mr. Roosevelt reached the conclusion to which he refers. It certainly was not in 1904, when the returns from Pennsylvania in the presidential election in that year were sent to him by me as chairman of the Republican state committee and to which I received from him in reply, the following letter:

"My Dear Senator Penrose: Upon my word, of all phenomena, the return from Pennsylvania are most phenomenal. I thank you. Faithfully yours, Theodore Roosevelt."

"In fact, during the whole period of Mr. Roosevelt's presidency, my relations with him were cordial. I cooperated with him in nearly all of his policies as a member of the United States senate, and when certain potential elements in the Republican party were plotting to defeat Mr. Roosevelt for the nomination in 1904, I was, as chairman of the Republican state committee of Pennsylvania, most active in having him endorsed at our state convention."

"I am further informed that Mr. Roosevelt refers to the fact that I opposed him for nomination at the Republican national convention in 1912, and I take it that this is the real reason for his change of attitude. Men are apt to be biased to their enemies and leaders to their friends."

"Mr. Roosevelt had assured me in the most positive terms that his ambition had been fully satisfied, and that under no circumstances would he ever be a candidate again for the presidency. He assured many members of the senate and prominent Republicans from all over the country to the same effect. He had taken himself, as far as we were informed, entirely out of consideration in connection with this office."

Worst Act of Bossism.

"In the Republican National convention Mr. Roosevelt at no time had a majority of the convention. The rules under which the convention acted regarding delegates and all other matters of procedure were precisely the rules which Mr. Roosevelt had insisted on in the National convention of 1908. It will be recalled that Mr. Roosevelt had absolutely named Mr. Taft for the presidency. Whether Mr. Roosevelt considers this an act of bossism or not, I don't know. But to me, at the time, it seemed like the most offensive act of bossism that could be perpetrated in American politics."

"In 1908 in the convention of which I am speaking, Mr. Roosevelt, through a cabinet officer who was in full charge and in hourly communication with the White House, insisted on defeating any rule proposed to alter the system of southern representation, it was defeated on the floor of the convention absolutely through the boss orders issued by Mr. Roosevelt's personal and official representative and the southern representation was maintained as heretofore. Delegates elected for Fairbanks were subsequently thrown out by the committee on credentials. All the other contests of delegates opposed to Taft were treated in about as cold-blooded a way as I have ever witnessed in my attendance on meetings of the National committee in 20 years. The convention was organized and nominated Mr. Taft."

T. R. Is Back in New York.
New York, July 1.—Colonel Theodore Roosevelt returned here today from Pittsburgh. He consulted Dr. H. H. Cullen, throat specialist, and then visited the editor of a New York magazine which will handle his Brazilian articles. The former president ate lunch with a party from the American Museum of Natural History. He returned to Oyster Bay at 3:15 o'clock.

advantage of it, has not been instrumental in the reduction of the rate, exporters say that the steamers in their agreements stipulated the right to receive orders at Colon instead of St. Vincent for orders. Going round the Horn or through the Straits of Magellan, the steamers call at Cape Verde islands, off the African coast, for orders; but if they see it to their benefit to take the canal route, they propose to receive the orders at Colon.

Shipping authorities declare that the steamship owners have taken this precaution this season because they do not know how expensive it will be to haul cargoes through the canal, although the opinion seems to prevail that it may amount to about \$2 the ton.

Shippers take the view that because of the low freight rates steamship owners are not going to send their vessels through the canal, but instead route them by way of Magellan, and thereby save what they can in tolls, time not being an important factor since no interest on the investment would be saved by tying their vessels up on their return to Europe. The view is taken that the low freight rates will mean less business for the canal.

For the present little wheat in changing hands in the Pacific northwest owing to the peculiar situation that prevails in Europe. Buyers here, and growers, too, are inclined to await some activity in Europe before transacting any large volume of business.

That a large movement is expected, however, is evident from the fact that vessels aggregating 32,000 tons net register have already been engaged for September and October loading at this port, the largest number under engagement at this time in the past five years. This means a total actual carrying capacity of more than 125,000 tons.
