BEAVERS LOSE TRACK OF FINE POINTS AND SEALS SNEAK AHEAD

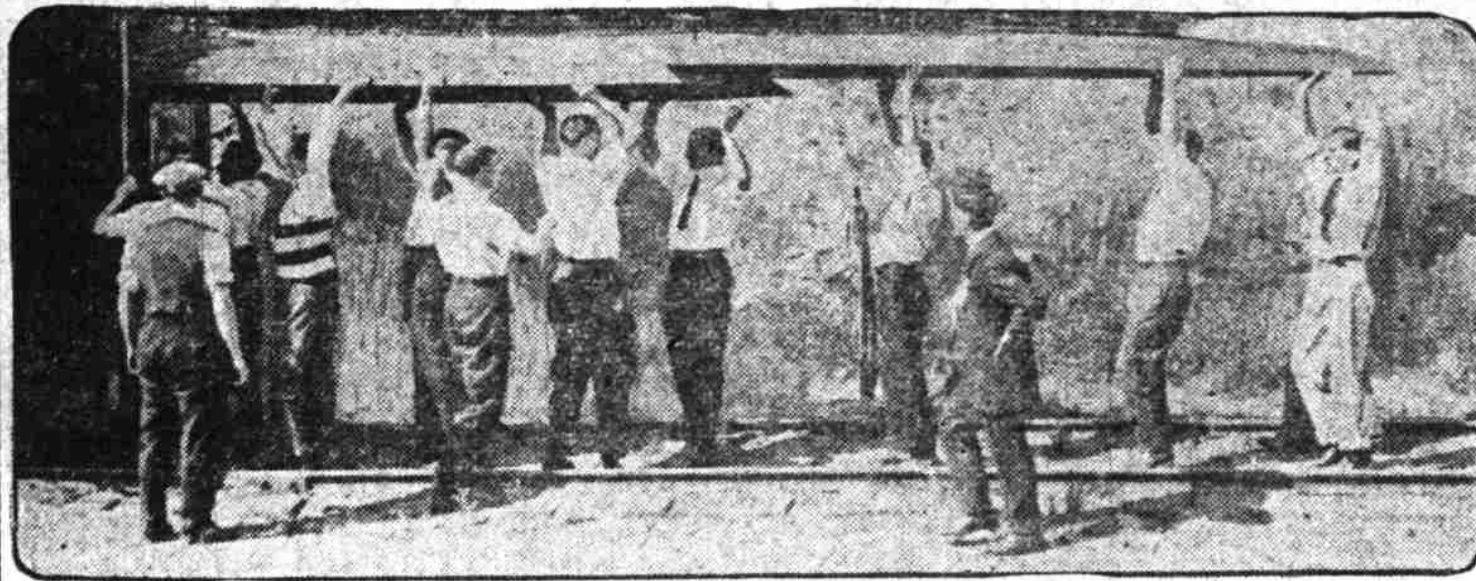
Harry Krause Fails to Cover First Base and Then the Bombardment Begins.

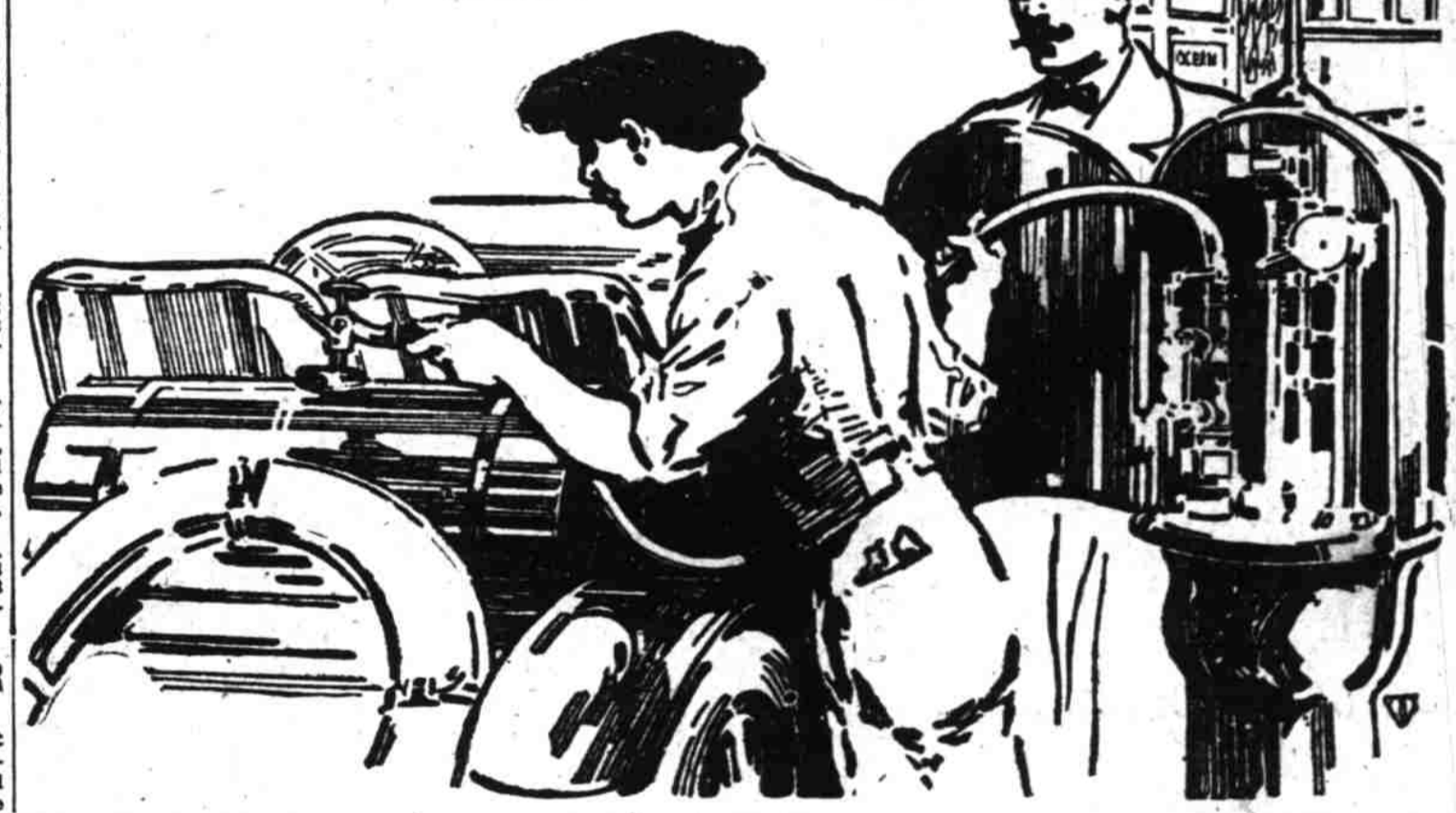

YACHT RESOLUTE WINNER

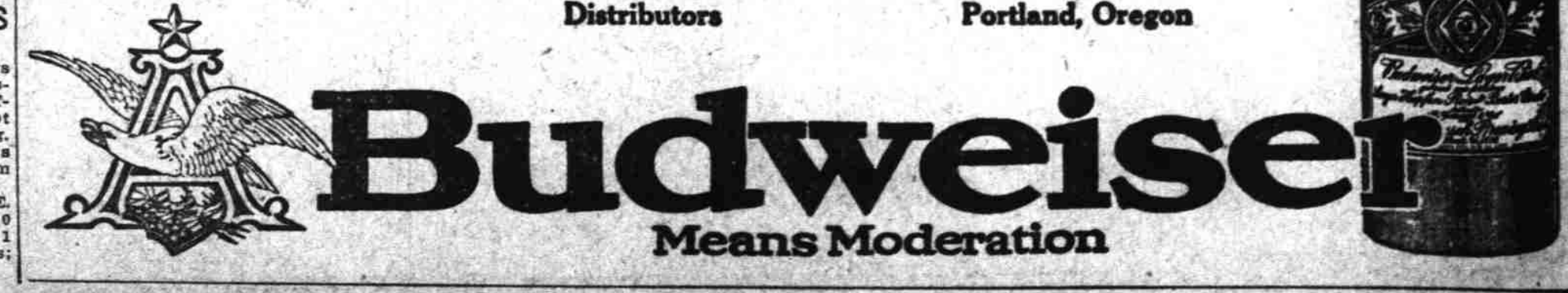
Newport, R. I., June 9.—The yacht Resolute won yesterday from the Vanitie in the first of a series of official trial races to select the defender of the title.
