Postmaster Buchanan Protests to Washington About Miss Weatherston.

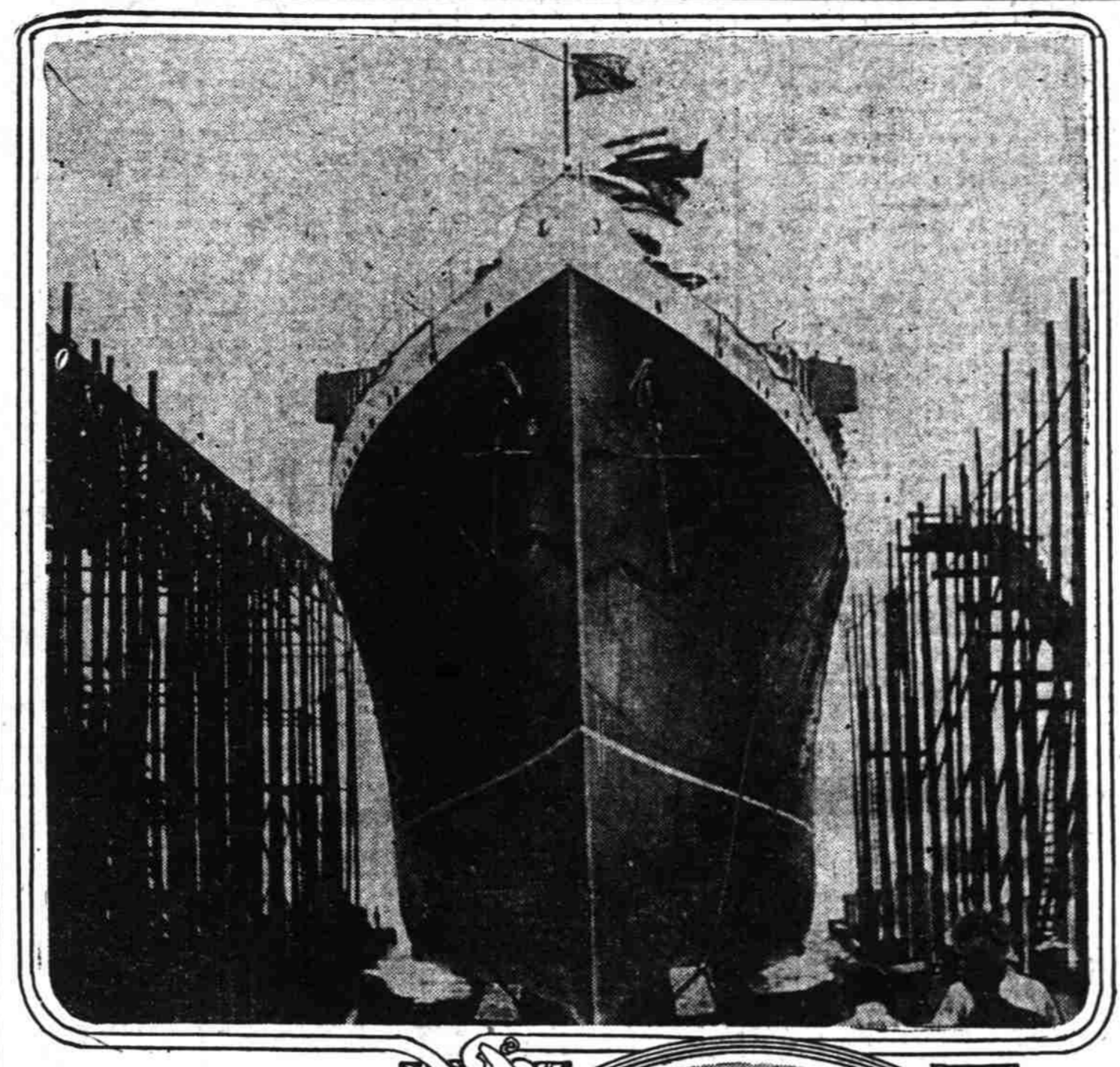

LAUNCHING OF GREAT NORTHERN AT PHILADELPHIA



First of the Two Vessels on Flavel-San Francisco Run Launched.

WHEAT CROP OF OVER 71,000,000 BUSHELLS BEING HARVESTED IN PACIFIC NORTHWEST DESPITE WEATHER HANDICAP PAST MONTH

Benson Gains Three Votes This Morning

Account of Ballots to Settle Question of Republican Nomination for Supreme Judge Continues.

Henry L. Benson of Klamath Falls gained three votes in the recount of the Multnomah county vote between himself and Charles L. McNary of Salem, for Republican nomination to the supreme court, this morning. In precinct 12 he was credited with 51 votes and it was found that 52 had voted for him, while McNary was credited with 66 votes and the recount showed but 66. In precinct 128 McNary was credited with 27 votes and it was found that the number should have been 26.

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N. H. DIRECTORS ARE BLAMED FOR JOY RIDING

Interstate Commerce Commission Reports That They Were "Criminally Negligent"; Broke Laws Wilfully

LOOSE, EXTRAVAGANT, SAID OF THE DIRECTORS

Monopolistic Theories Unsound; Total Losses of Stockholders Great.

(United Press Leased Wire.) Washington, July 13.—The gist of the Interstate Commerce commission's report today on the result of its investigation of New Haven railroad affairs was that the management's monopolistic theories were unsound and criminally negligent; and that a substantial part of the stockholders' money they wasted could be recovered.

Directors Held Responsible

It was left up to Attorney General McReynolds to act on the finding that the directors were criminally responsible. Solicitor Felt, the commission said the report made them responsible for more than \$67,000,000. The commission estimated that the total loss to stockholders through mismanagement and carelessness was \$20,000,000 to \$40,000,000.

Many Laws Violated

"Many instances have been uncovered of violations of the laws of different states. We have turned over the evidence concerning local practices in New York to the district attorney of the proper districts, and testimony regarding irregularities in Massachusetts and Rhode Island has been laid before the proper authorities in those states.

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
