Fuller Use of Rivers Requested

Portland Asked to Join the Nation-
wide Movement in Interest of Naviga-
tion; Indorsements.

Overtures have been made by the
Inland Navigation Bureau, with head-
quarters at New Orleans, La., asking
that Portland interests affiliate with
it in a nation-wide movement for full-
er use of the rivers for navigation.
John H. Bernhard, manager of the
bureau, has sent prospectuses and in-
dorsements of the plan, which were re-
ceived today by the Chamber of Com-
merce.

The bureau proposes to standardize
river craft, work for the improvement
of water terminals, make uniform tar-
iff rates and equalize insurance
charges. Among the indorsements are
those from the governor of Louisiana,
commercial organizations of Missis-
sippi river cities and several senators and
congressmen.

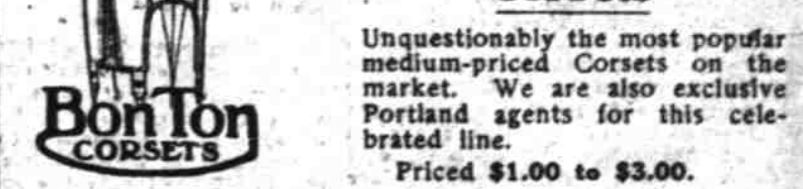
