Medical Ass'n in Vienna Celebrates Fourth of July Enthusiastically.

Dr. Ray W. Matson of Portland, who is doing special work in the treatment of tuberculosis in connection with the American Medical association of Vienna, has sent pictures showing the murderer of Archduke Franz Ferdinand and his wife, the man who threw the bomb, and the archduke and his family photographed just before the tragedy.

Dr. Matson and his wife have been in Vienna several months. He expects to return to Portland next January. In a letter he says that it seemed almost like America when on the Fourth of July, the entire Medical association of Vienna, together with 200 American surgeons and their wives who were on their way to the surgical congress in London, celebrated the national holiday in a most fitting and enthusiastic manner.

SPAIN THREATENED BY REVOLUTIONISTS WHO TRY FOR COMMUNISM

Effort Being Made to Bring About Concerted Action Against Monarchy.

TO CONCENTRATE TROOPS

Loss of Premier Canalejas Has Severe Blow to Alfonso, Who Has Never Found Satisfactory Successor.

(United Press Leased Wire.) Madrid, July 19, via Hengaye, France, July 20.—Revolutionary mutterings are growing very alarming throughout Spain.

Discontent has been rife for a long time, but hitherto the monarchy has been saved by the racial differences between the peoples of various sections of the country.

Good judges of the situation say that the Catalan provinces' uprising a few years ago, culminating in the execution of Francisco Ferrer, probably would have overthrown the government if it had spread to the rest of the country. The people of the Basque, central and southern provinces, however, did not regard the Catalans as Spaniards, and watched the struggle indifferently.

Subsequent outbreaks at Bilbao, Medina Del Campo, Valencia, Cadiz and elsewhere were similarly put down separately.

Working for Joint Action. Of late, however, revolutionary leaders, seeing the importance of unity, have been working indefatigably to weld the masses together, at least for a joint fight against King Alfonso and his government. There are many signs that they have met with marked success, and it is plain that the government heads realize it.

Troops have been concentrated at strategic points. The garrison here has been heavily increased. A picked detachment is constantly on guard at the very entrance to the royal palace here. The civil guard, a formidable gendarmerie, consisting of much the same material as the gunmen said to figure in American strike troubles, has been numerically strengthened.

King Alfonso suffered a severe blow in the assassination of Premier Canalejas. The latter, originally an avowed Republican and even at the time of his death a Liberal, although a convert to monarchism, was an adept at yielding just enough to popular demand to stave off revolt, without going quite to the point of weakening the government.

Alfonso has never been able to find a satisfactory successor to him and conditions have been growing steadily worse since his death.

Efforts have been made by his supporters to prove that Alfonso is personally popular and would be the first president even were a republic established.

In point of fact, the king is generally considered a tool in his ministers' hands, as a mental weakling and as physically in so bad a state from hereditary disease that it is only by the most constant care and expert medical attention that he is kept alive.

While it is true, too, that in the larger cities there is some sentiment in favor of a formal republic, with a regularly elected president, the popular demand in the villages and country districts is for a system of communism, with little or no pretense at a central government, republican or otherwise.

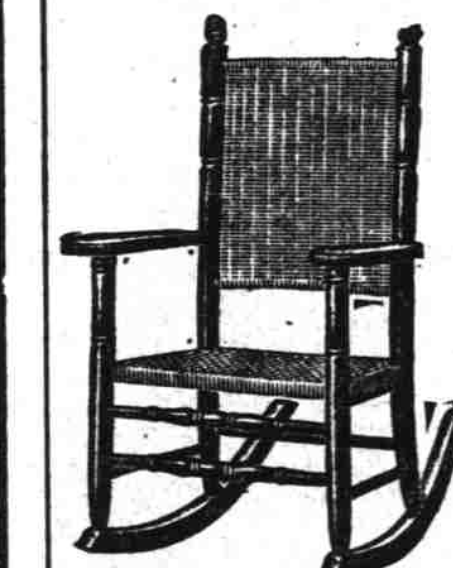
