**U'Ren May Forego Running for Office**

If Candidate Remains in Gubernatorial Race He May Have to Do So as Prohibitionist Only.

It is possible that W. S. U'Ren of Oregon City will have to forego his intention to run as an independent candidate for governor and if he remains in the race do so solely as the nominee of the Prohibition party.

This will be due to section 218 of the election laws, which was amended by the last legislature. This section says:

"No independent or nonpartisan candidate shall be permitted to use any word of the name of any existing political party or organization in his candidacy, nor shall he be permitted to use any other name than 'Independent' or 'Nonpartisan.'"

As Mr. U'Ren has accepted the nomination of the Prohibition party, it appears that he will be prevented from also running as an independent candidate.

Mr. U'Ren has written to Secretary of State Ben W. Clapp for his interpretation of the section in question, and it is known also that he has given instructions to have the circulation of the petitions for his independent candidacy stopped.

It was reported yesterday that Mr. U'Ren would withdraw entirely from the race, but he denies this and says he intends to stay in the running.

**Farmers Will Get Chance at Show**

Displays Will Be Made by Oregon Agricultural College; Series of Talks on Farming.

Farmers will have their longings at the Manufacturers' and Land Products show next fall when the Oregon Agricultural college will have displays and lectures showing modern ways to improve work and life in the country.

Professor Paul H. Scott, director of the extension department, conferred Tuesday with the show management and made reservations for 800 square feet of exhibit space.

A series of talks on better farming will be made during the three weeks of the show. Speakers from several states will tell of soil improvement, proper feeding of livestock, improving the quality of seed and the hundreds of problems of the farm.

Morrow county has enrolled in the list of counties to secure space for land products exhibits. The counties now in line are Marion, Clatsop, Baker, Multnomah and the four southern counties.

Governor Lister of Washington today accepted a place on the honorary advisory committee and announced he would assist in a committee to cooperate and send exhibits. The governors of Oregon, Idaho and Utah already had accepted places and the management is now waiting for word from Governor Hiram Johnson of California.
