

HARD WALLOPING AND SHARP FIELDING GAIN BEAVERS ANOTHER WIN

Thirteen Swats and Five Double Outs Staged by Mackmen—Stroud Is Easy.

By piling thirteen lusty swats and killing the rallies of the visitors with double plays, the Beaver champs downed the Sacramento Solons yesterday in the second game of the series by the score of 6 to 3.

Five two-out plays were staged by the local infielders and all aided in pulling Southpaw Evans out of hot water. Evans was not very steady and allowed the visitors to get runners on the bases in every inning.

Stroud was easy for the Beavers and the way the Portlanders started to hit him indicated that there was no doubt as to the result of the game.

Moran's single, Young's sacrifice, Orr's infield out and Tennant's single resulted in a tally for the visitors in the first inning, but Portland jumped into the lead after two were out. Rodgers singled and stole and scored on Doane's single. Doane stole second and scored on Young's single. Kores, who was hit by a pitched ball, was put out at third by Moran and Cook.

Orr's triple scored Moran, who forced Stroud out at second, in the third, but the Solons remained on even basis with the change but a short time. Baneroff singled, but was forced at second by Spens, who scored on Rodgers' single. Doane's out put Rodgers on third and he scored on Kores' single. Kores stole second and tallied when Ryan hit to right.

David's double and Fisher's single gave the Beavers another tally in the sixth. By sending three pinch hitters and an extra base runner to the front in the ninth Wolverton succeeded in scoring a run for his team.

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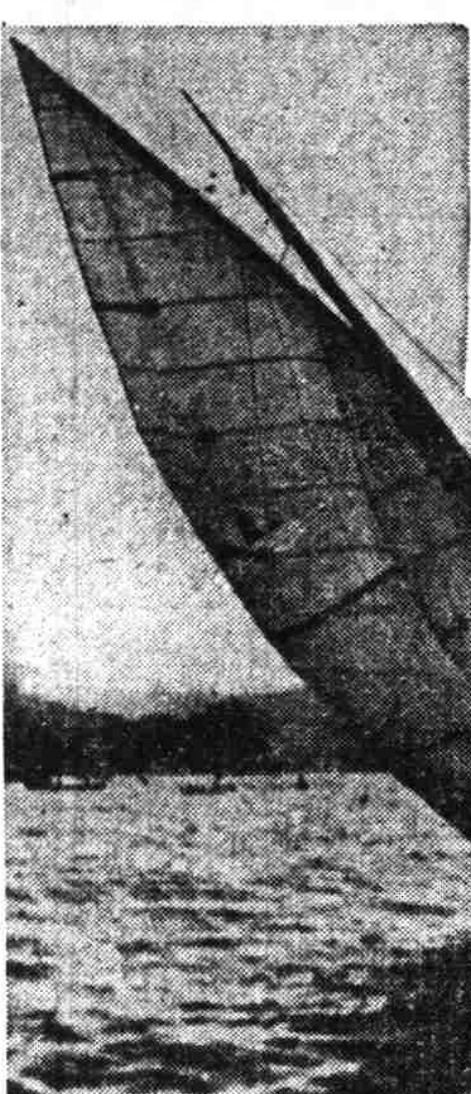
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HOLDER OF CLASS A YACHT TITLE
