NOTES OF WEDNESDAY'S HAPPENINGS

Brief Paragraphs Give Journal Readers the News of Late Yesterday Afternoon and Last Night.

Eastern.

La Lorraine, which left New York for Havre, carrying 700 French reservists, arrived safely at her destination.

Mrs. Blanche Murphy was found not guilty of the murder of her husband, Patrick Murphy, in Chicago, making the fifteenth woman acquitted on a murder charge in Cook county in the last three years.

John P. Holland, aged 72, inventor of the submarine, died of pneumonia at his home in Newark, N. J.

Because the law of extradition has been suspended while the war is in progress, three New York detectives have been compelled to return from Europe without their prisoners.

R. L. Williams, Democratic candidate for governor of Oklahoma, won the nomination. Contest will be instituted in five counties by J. B. Robertson, defeated candidate.

The members of the I. W. W. were condemned as enemies of Christian workmen at the convention of the Central Union at Pittsburgh.

The United States Senate of Texas has announced that he will be a candidate for the United States senate in 1916.

The British steamer Sagamore left New York for Liverpool with six cabin passengers and 168,000 bushels of grain.

The British have notified Washington that the North Atlantic ocean was free from German warships and that merchantmen were safe in traveling the sea.

Another upward price in sugar has been announced in New York, fine granulated being quoted at 6 1/2 to 7 cents a pound.

Suspension of reserve requirements is one of the means to be urged by New York bankers for settlement of the country's financial obligations.

Gold shipments are resisted. Improvement in conditions has been noted.

The American liner Philadelphia arrived at New York with American refugees. Nearly all of the 1000 passengers were without baggage and most of them were without money.

Warren G. Harding won the Republican nomination for United States senator from Ohio, defeating ex-Senator Foraker.

Executive.

It was understood the dissolution of the New Haven railroad merger would not prevent criminal prosecution of the directors.

Paul M. Warburg, the new federal reserve board appointee, says he will sever all his connections with banking firms and will devote his entire time to the work which President Wilson asked him to take up.

The house and senate conferees on the administration federal trade commission bill had a conference. The section of the bill relating to unfair competition is the greatest obstacle to overcome. Meetings will be held daily hereafter.

Foreign.

The German torpedo boat destroyer which was sunk by a mine, off the coast of Gedser, August 5, was destroyed by a mine which the Germans had put down, it is announced from London.

Brussels dispatch says that the Kaiser is on the way to Belgium to take personal charge of the German armies in the field there.

The Duchess of Sutherland has been placed in charge of the Red Cross work in Belgium, says a London report.

Dowager Empress Mary Fedorovna of Russia has arrived at Bern, Switzerland.

Barbers Have Strong Organization.

Presmen, Stereotypers and Mailers Have Plans for Their Excursion Sunday Next to Columbia City.

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Farmers About Kermistion and Stanfield Assist Officials and Game Birds Are Multiplying Rapidly.

Pendleton, Or., Aug. 13.—The section of Umatilla county about Hermiston and Stanfield has developed into an ideal community from the standpoint of game protection. Under this protection the value of game birds as destroyers of insects and other harmful insects and joining in giving them every protection. Under this protection Mr. Averill declares that the prairie chicken, which a few years ago was almost extinct, is multiplying rapidly. That the Bob White quail are becoming so numerous as to suggest old-time eastern fields, and the Hungarian and China pheasants are thriving.

Mr. Averill claims his belief that there are now more Bob White quail in this section than at any point in Oregon. Fully 500 prairie chickens are now there, whereas a few years ago there were only two known bands of these birds in Umatilla county.
