**War Reports Hard To Forward in 1870**  
Newspaper of September 16, 1870, Gives Delayed Account of Siege at Sedan.

Even with the strict censorship of despatches from abroad and the absence of direct communication with Germany, it takes but a glance at papers of the Franco-Prussian war period to demonstrate how vastly improved are the news gathering facilities of the present.

H. W. G. Willimont of 10 East Sixty-third street has a copy of the Cambrian of Swansea, England, for September 16, 1870, which contains war news under date of September 1, and from so short a distance as Paris at that time.

Detailed in the news are reports of the capitulation of Sedan as officially given out by the German government and of the advance on Paris.

Prominent among the despatches is one from Liege, where the big battle of the present war is now raging, announcing that the Belgian government had determined to recognize the new French republic.

Towns along the present Franco-German border which were then part of France receive mention in many of the Paris news items. It is significant that not a single telegraph dispatch bearing directly on the war is within three days of the date of publication.
