CONTRACT LET FOR
LAST HIGHWAY UNIT
IN CLATSOP COUNTY

Jeffery & Bufton, Portland
Firm, Successful; to Start
Work Within Ten Days.

(Special to The Journal.)
Astoria, Or., Aug. 20.—The last of the three big contracts connected with the construction of the Columbia river highway in Clatsop county was awarded by the county court last evening to Jeffery & Bufton of Portland, the price being \$55,519.70. The contract was let on a unit price basis, and based on the advertised quantities. The plan is the same as in effect in the east end of the county. By this plan the court is in a position to say just how much of the improvement is to be made, more or less, as conditions may warrant. The contract price is \$7000 below the engineer's estimate of the work.

The right of way to be improved extends from a point 16 miles south of Seaside to the Tillamook county line, and when completed will connect with the coast road in Tillamook county, giving direct connections with Nehalem City and other points in that part of the state. The stretch of right of way to be improved is nine miles long. Major Bowby and L. Griswold, highway engineers, as well as the members of the county court, express themselves as well pleased with the awarding of the contract. L. E. Bufton, representing Jeffery & Bufton, was here yesterday and when notified that he was the successful bidder said that he would have his equipment on the ground ready to start the work in 10 days. The improvement, according to the contract, must be completed by May 1, 1915.

Government Asked To Purchase Ships

Hamburg and North German Lloyd Lines Believed to Have Made Offer; Appropriation Bill. Washington, Aug. 20.—Offers to sell ships to the United States were received by government officials here today. The identity of the steamship lines making the offers was not known but, it was believed they were the Hamburg-American and the North German Lloyd lines. The bill providing an appropriation of \$15,000,000 to buy merchantmen will be introduced in the house, it was announced, some time this week.

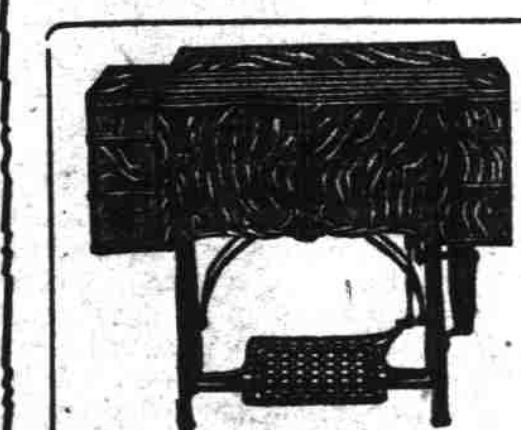
