

DAHLIA SHOW OF OREGON SOCIETY TO OPEN OCTOBER 9

Exhibit in Central Library
Building Scheduled to Last
Two Days.

ENTRIES OPEN TO ALL

Long List of Prizes Has Been Pre-
pared; No Entry Fee Will Be
Charged Exhibitors.

The second annual dahlia show of the Oregon Dahlia society will be held in the Central library building Oct. 9 and 10, and anyone can make entries provided they live up to the regulations governing the show.

All entries must be made before 10 o'clock of the day of the show and must be staged by 1 p. m. No entry fee will be charged.

A first and second prize will be awarded on all entries in the following list:

- Class A.**
1. Best general exhibit of dahlias containing three or more classes and at least 10 varieties. Must show not less than 20 stems to compete.
 2. Best general exhibit of cactus dahlias, not less than 12 stems and containing at least six varieties.
 3. Best general exhibit of decorative dahlias, not less than 12 stems in not less than six varieties.
 4. Best general exhibit of peony dahlias, not less than 12 stems in not less than six varieties.
 5. Best general exhibit of show dahlias, not less than 12 stems in not less than six varieties.
 6. Best general exhibit of pompon dahlias, not less than 12 stems in one or more varieties.
 7. Best general exhibit of collarette dahlias, not less than 12 stems in one or more varieties.
 8. Best general exhibit of single dahlias, not less than 12 stems in not less than three varieties.

- Class B—Cactus Dahlias.**
- All entries in this class shall contain three stems, of the color described, all three blooms to be of the same variety.
1. Best vase red shade cactus dahlia.
 2. Best vase yellow cactus dahlia.
 3. Best vase white cactus dahlia.
 4. Best vase pink cactus dahlia.
 5. Best vase orange shade cactus dahlia.
 6. Best vase maroon cactus dahlia.
 7. Best vase lavender shade cactus dahlia.
 8. Best vase striped or variegated cactus dahlia.
 9. Best vase of any unmentioned color of cactus dahlia.

- Class C—Decorative Dahlias.**
- All entries in this class shall contain three stems, all three blooms to be of the same variety.
1. Best vase white decorative dahlia.
 2. Best vase red shade decorative dahlia.
 3. Best vase pink decorative dahlia.
 4. Best vase yellow decorative dahlia.
 5. Best vase maroon shade decorative dahlia.
 6. Best vase striped and variegated decorative dahlia.
 7. Best vase bronze or orange shade decorative dahlia.
 8. Best vase lavender shade decorative dahlia.

- Class D—Peony Dahlias.**
- All entries in this class shall contain three stems, all three to be of the same variety.
1. Best vase white peony dahlia.
 2. Best vase yellow shade peony dahlia.
 3. Best vase red shade peony dahlia.
 4. Best vase pink peony dahlia.
 5. Best vase unmentioned color peony dahlia.
 6. Best vase Geisha peony dahlia.
 7. Best vase Bertha Van Suttner dahlia.
 8. Best vase lavender shade peony dahlia.
 9. Best vase orange shade peony dahlia.

- Class E—Show Dahlias.**
- All entries in this class shall contain three stems, all three to be of the same variety.
1. Best vase red shade show dahlia.
 2. Best vase yellow show dahlia.
 3. Best vase pink show dahlia.
 4. Best vase white show dahlia.
 5. Best vase lavender show dahlia.
 6. Best vase unmentioned color in show dahlia.

- Class F.**
1. Best basket of dahlias, any foliage and ribbons allowed for decoration.
 2. Best bowl of dahlias, any foliage allowed.

- Class G—Private Gardens.**
1. Best general exhibit of dahlias grown and exhibited by private gardeners.

- Class H—Commercial Growers.**
- Standard Varieties.**
1. Best exhibit of 12 cactus dahlias, 12 varieties or more.
 2. Best exhibit of 12 decorative dahlias, 12 varieties or more.
 3. Best exhibit of 12 show dahlias, 12 varieties or more.
 4. Best exhibit of 12 single dahlias, 6 varieties or more.
 5. Best exhibit of 12 peony dahlias, 6 varieties or more.
 6. Best exhibit of 12 pompon dahlias, 6 varieties or more.
 7. Best exhibit of 12 collarette dahlias, 6 varieties or more.
 8. Best exhibit of 12 pompon dahlias, 6 varieties or more.

- Class I—Novelty—Commercial Growers.**
1. A prize for novelties is also offered on the same list as Class H, except that only one plant as many varieties are required in each entry.

- Score card as follows: 50 per cent for perfection of flowers, 25 per cent for size, 15 per cent for arrangement and general effect.

- Class J.**
1. For largest dahlia by diameter measurement.

- Class K.**
1. For the best display made by any city or community.

- Class L—School Displays.**
1. For the best general display by any school, to be gathered from dahlias grown in school or home gardens by school children. Display must contain not over 100 blooms and to be arranged by school children.

AMERICAN WHO HAS DONE GOOD WORK



James W. Gerard, United States Ambassador at Berlin.

Berlin, Aug. 29.—Throughout the trying month of war, the work of James W. Gerard, United States ambassador, has evoked constant praise. He has led in relieving Americans, conveying parties personally to the Dutch frontier in some cases. He has saved many Americans accused as spies. Moreover, Kaiser William has trusted him highly, and attempted to communicate the case of Germany through him to the American people.

Mr. Gerard is thin and worn in appearance, but he keeps up his terrifically strenuous life. It is not exactly what an ambassador expects when he bargains for his job, but Mr. Gerard has accepted his task enthusiastically just the same.

PAY TAXES BEFORE 9 P. M. TOMORROW TO ESCAPE INTEREST

After That Hour Penalty of
10 Per Cent As Well Will
Be Imposed.

Until 9 o'clock tomorrow night the tax office will remain open for those who desire to make payments before penalties and interest are added to their taxes. Tuesday morning a penalty of 10 per cent on all unpaid taxes will be charged, and interest will begin to accrue at 12 per cent per annum.

Those who made first half payments prior to April 1 will pay only the remaining half. Those who failed to make any payment will be charged 1 per cent a month on all taxes. These conditions are effective only up to closing time tomorrow evening. After that time the 1 per cent per month interest will be wiped out and the penalty and 12 per cent interest will take its place.

Taxpayers will be saved much time if they take or mail their receipts for half payments with their second half payments, as it will save the deputies from the task of hunting up the records. People who desire to mail checks may mail them at any time Monday, provided the letters are in time to receive the cancellation stamp of Monday. Letters postmarked Monday will be accepted as payment on Monday and will save taxpayers from penalties.

Chief Deputy Hucksby of the tax department estimated that \$1,000,000 is yet to be collected in second half payments, but that nearly one half of that amount is due from public service corporations and large property owners. He said that these payments had evidently been held back so that the last day's interest might be saved to the payers. He anticipated not over \$600,000 in delinquent taxes, a not unusual percentage.

Dogs to Get Mail**

Flushing, New York, Postmaster Issues Order After Six Carriers Are Bitten by Savage Canines.

New York, Aug. 29.—Orders have been issued by Postmaster Alfred J. Kennedy of the Flushing postoffice and communicated to residents of the district through mail carriers, that commencing Monday, mail will not be delivered to any house where the owner has a dog that is not kept tied or muzzled. This order affects Woodside, Elmhurst, Corona, Flushing, College Point, Whitestone, Bayside, Goughland and Little Neck.

The order was issued after Henry Inholz, a carrier, had been bitten badly by a dog. The postmaster said that this was the sixth mail carrier who has been bitten this month.
