Fish Thrive on New Feed Plan Nineteen Million Salmon Eggs Taken from Backs of McKenzie and Willamette Rivers in Lane County. Eugene, Or., Oct. 12.—Nineteen million salmon eggs were taken from the fish racks on the McKenzie and Willamette rivers in Lane county this year, according to the statement of R. E. Clanton, master fish warden of the state, who was here yesterday with the state fish car "Rainbow." ...

"Four years ago a new system of feeding the salmon in the ponds was established," said Clanton, "and as a result there has been an enormous run of the fish, especially the blue back, lately. It was thought this variety was nearly extinct, but it appears that the new methods employed at the McKenzie and Willamette fish racks have been the means of increasing the number of this species. The 'Rainbow' brought to Eugene 34,000 four-inch eastern brook trout which were distributed Saturday and Sunday in various small streams all the way from Halsey, in Linn county, to Colgate Grove, in the southern part of Lane county."
