

GERMAN CENTER MAY BE OUT-FLANKED AND FORCED TO RETREAT, BELIEVES PARIS.

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ALLIES REPORT NEW GAINS

French Say Allies Occupied Fleur-Baix and the Vicinity of Arras, Gained Ground Elsewhere.

(United Press Leased Wire.)
Paris, Oct. 17.—The German center in Belgium having been out-flanked and forced to retreat, such a development, military experts said, would disorganize the Kaiser's entire line.

Army authorities did not try to hide their opinion that the invaders would soon be forced to quit France.

Roundabout information from Ostend by way of Flushing was that some German troops remained in the Belgian seaport, the rest being withdrawn for active service on the fighting lines. The Germans were said to be treating the Ostenders considerably better.

REPORT OF GERMANS STATES RESULTS ARE NOWHERE DECISIVE

Berlin, via The Hague, Oct. 17.—The German forces in Belgium having effected a junction with the Kaiser's fighting wing in France, a series of engagements with the allies was in progress today all along the front between the regions of Novon and Roye northward into Belgian territory, the war office announced.

On both sides, it was said, there had been slight gains in some places and losses in others, several positions having been taken and retaken as much as four times. Nowhere, however, was the war office reported, had the results been decisive, though in a general way the situation was improving, from the German standpoint.

Weather Called "Shocking."
The weather was declared to be shocking.

Official announcement was made of the German occupation of Arras, Thursday, no resistance being made and the burghmaster surrendering the city.

At the German center and left, it was said the situation remained unchanged.

Rain and snow were reported to be harassing operations in Alsace-Lorraine and the Vosges.

In the eastern theatre of war, it was declared, the Germans were gaining in Russian Poland, while in East Prussia a Russian remained on German soil.

Austrians Are Advancing.

The Austrians, said the war office, had occupied the heights of Starasol, east of the town of Olvova, Galicia, and were advancing along the River San.

Touching on the conflicting claims from Russian and Austrian sources concerning the fate of Olvova, the German official statement declared that General Dimitreff, the Bulgarian officer in charge of the beleaguered town, had "failed to check the Austrians, who were marching to relieve the fortress."

The Austrian artillery was said to have destroyed many Russian temporary bridges and was demolishing large numbers of their defenders.

Allies Announce Gains.
Paris, Oct. 17.—Gains by the allies in the regions of Arras and St. Mihiel and the occupation by them of the district around Arras and the village of Fleur-Baix were claimed in the official statement received from the war ministry in general, however, it was said the situation remained unchanged.

"Comparative quiet," said the official statement, "reigns along most of the front."

"In Belgium the Germans have not passed the Ostend-Thourout-Roulers-Menin line."

"On our left wing there is no change in the situation in the region of Ypres."

"On the right bank of the Lys we have occupied the village of Fleur-Baix. We have also occupied the vicinity of Arras."

"In the regions of Arras and St. Mihiel we have continued to gain ground."

"No noticeable change has taken place in the situation of the east Prussian front."

"Along the course of the middle Vistula the Austrians and Germans have been compelled to assume the offensive throughout their entire front."

"The conflict south of Przemyel still continues. The Russians have captured 500 prisoners."

Authorities Release "Puzzle" Advertiser

Man Offered Lots in California to Persons Solving Simple Puzzle and Paying Cost of Recording Deeds.

C. T. Selby, who advertised lots in the heart of California in exchange for solving a simple puzzle and paying the cost of recording deeds, was released by the federal authorities yesterday on \$500 bail, pending a further investigation into his scheme. He will appear before the federal grand jury in November.

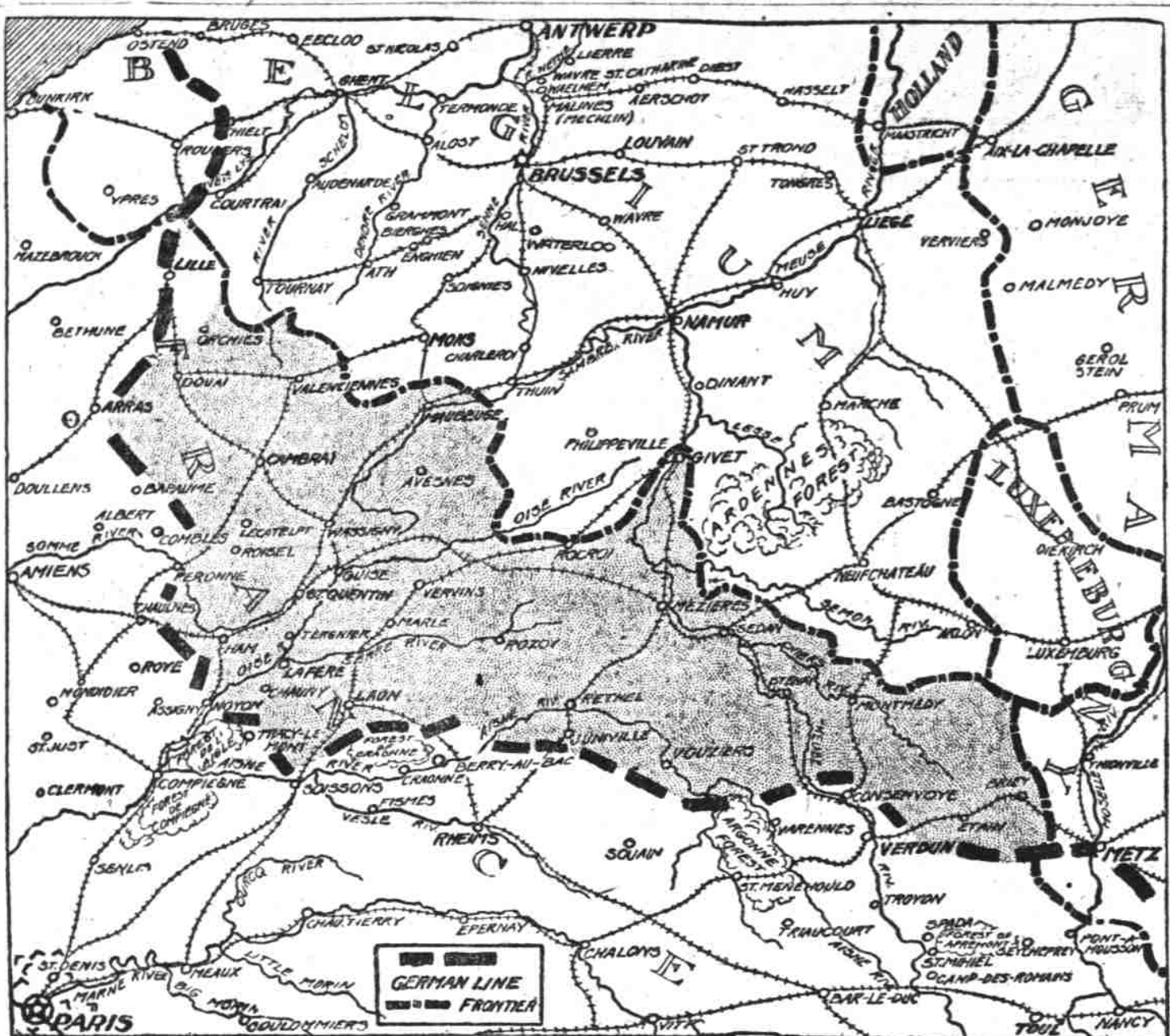
Under the name of the Central Building and Financing company with offices in the Chamber of Commerce Building, Selby inserted advertisements in a number of rural newspapers.

According to Deputy United States Attorney Johnson, he hooked three weeks but puzzle solvers apparently were not anxious to "bite" at the bait and Selby failed to profit.

The lots were said to be in Tobin Park on the seashore and within easy reach of San Francisco by electric line. The federal authorities of California notified local officials that the land in question was two miles from a trolley line, is worth about \$10 per lot and is not situated along the ocean beach.

Selby's alleged plan was to convince each of the solvers that he successfully solved the problem, and then offer them the lots for \$27.50, the money representing the alleged cost of examining title and making and recording deeds.

FRESH EXPEDITION TO CONTINENT WILL SOON BE READY FOR SAILING

Dearth of Supplies Has Been Overcome and Gun Plants Are Rushing.

London, Oct. 17.—The energy with which the war office today was rushing the departure of army recruits left no doubt that another expedition was to leave shortly for France.

The principal difficulty heretofore has been the dearth of supplies. These were at last beginning to be available in sufficient quantities. Gun and ammunition plants are running on a 24-hour schedule. Uniforms are being turned out just as fast as they are needed.

There are already efficient quarter-master officers at the front, but more are needed here and war ministers Lord Kitchener is personally supervising the reorganization of this department.

Army enlistments were considerably increased in number by the enthusiasm created by the Belgian king's declaration that he nor the queen would accept asylum in Germany, but that they would remain with the Belgian army, continuing their resistance to the last.

The queen had previously been reported to have arrived in England but this afterward proved to be untrue; it was learned definitely that she remained with her husband and would continue to do so while he stayed in the field.

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Sleuths Solve Deaf And Dumb Puzzle

Man Arrested for Begging Had Successfully Deceived Detectives for Period of Two Hours.

Posing successfully as a deaf and dumb person, it required two hours for City Detectives Hellyer and Tackaberry to discover that Walter Adams, who had been begging on strength of his afflictions on the east side, was all of his senses.

Adams, after being arrested, was found to have a voting registration and in the name of William J. Austin, Precinct 41, Perkins hotel, and on being questioned said that he registered as a qualified voter Wednesday.

He is held on the charge of fraudulent registration.

Adams had 25 letters, all signed by Frank Barnett, sheriff of Alameda county, California, in which it was stated that Adams had lost his speech and hearing through an attack of spinal meningitis. These letters were shown to housewives and business men, and these people buy a package of court plaster from him.

At the detective headquarters, Adams understood all the tests of sound and vision that were made and did not until another prisoner sitting near by identified him as one with whom he had served time on the rockpile, did Adams speak. Records were produced showing that he had been punished at San Diego in 1912, at Seattle in 1912, and here two years ago for the same offense, and all of these records were admitted. He came to Portland less than a week ago, he said, and the registration, he confessed, was false and made up an assumed name. The arrest was made at Grand avenue and Lincoln street. He is fluently conversant in the deaf and dumb sign language.

PREMIER SALANDRA IS HOLDING MINISTRY OF FOREIGN AFFAIRS NOW

As Soon as Suitable, Successor for Guiliano Can Be Secured, He Will Be.

Rome, Oct. 17.—Premier Salandra was in charge of the ministry of foreign affairs, left vacant by the death of Marquis di San Giuliano.

It was understood this was only a temporary arrangement and that as soon as a suitable person was suggested to the marquis could be found, the premier would turn the portfolio over to him. It was not denied in official circles that the marquis was likely to be made with more or less regard to account of the pre-arranged state of affairs throughout Europe.

The marquis' death was considered likely to hasten the two things—definite assurance of Italy's neutrality in the European war or its actual participation in the struggle.

The Italian foreign minister, having been firm for neutrality, there was of course the possibility that a weaker successor or one who favored hostilities might permit the country to be drawn into the conflict. On the other hand, there was the alternative possibility that the Teutonic allies, appreciating this danger and realizing that the Italians would be opposed to Austria-Hungary if they fought at all, would concede voluntarily to Italy enough of what it might gain in war to make war itself unnecessary.

There were, in fact, reports current today that Austria was about to make certain territorial concessions to the Italians and to agree to a permanent foothold for them in Albania.

In this connection, the semi-official statement that the marquis' death would not affect the government's foreign policy—which has hitherto been to remain neutral—was deemed significant.

DISCUSS TAX MEASURES

Charles V. Galloway of the legislative tax commission, A. D. Criggs, secretary of the Home Tax Exemption league, and George C. WATERFRONT BILLS BACKED BY CENTRAL LABOR ORGANIZATION

Report Rendered by Committee on Legislation at the Meeting Last Night.

Strong endorsement of initiative measures No. 328, the public docks and waterfront amendment, and No. 329, authorizing cities to construct public wharves and docks on water front lands belonging to the state, is contained in the report of the committee on legislation of the Central Labor council read before that body last night.

The committee reported on all the measures to be voted upon November 3. Its report was modified in some instances but in the main was adopted as read.
