Candidates on the Democratic ticket for county officers were the speakers at an enthusiastic meeting of the Jackson club at the Commercial club last

They urged their hearers to lend their support to the Wilson administration by voting for Schator Chamberlain and A. F. Fiegel and in support of good government in Oregon by voting for Dr. C. J. Smith. And they asked the voters in the excitement of the campaign for the larger and more important offices at the head of the ticket not to forget those at the foot.

A Democratic meeting was held at the Davis school, Twenty-first and Raleigh streets, last night at which campaign issues were discussed by sev eral Democratic candidates. George H. Watson, chairman of the county cen-tral committee, presided. Among the speakers were Roscoe P. Hurst, candidate for state senator; B. Lee Paget, candidate for state treasurer, and Dr. A. K. Higgs, legislative candidate.

### Portland Boy Writes Norway Impressions

That the boys of Norway seem to have much more leisure time than American boys is an observation that forcefully struck Thorsten Thorpe, a Journal carrier, who now is on a visit to Scandinavia and who writes from Aasgaardstrand, Norway, in part as follows: "This is such a small place, haven't much to do: none of the boys has. Once in a while I go after a bunch of wood. It isn't like America, where there are always many things to do.

"There are paper boys in Christi-They deliver their papers from 3 o'clock to 4 o'clock every morn-There are no evening papers. They only receive \$5 a month.

"I don't think we will stay here this winter for, if we do, I am sure we will freeze. For now (Sept. 27) it is so cold after the sun goes down that I have to put on a heavy coat. The snow will come pretty soon, fruit time is over in Norway. They have the same varieties we do in Or-

egon, except the apricot. There are many boys in Aasgaard-They all want to see how strong an American is, so they are always picking fights. When I told one of my cousins where I was from he said: 'Portland, that's where the cement comes from."


