Temperance Rally Next Sunday Night

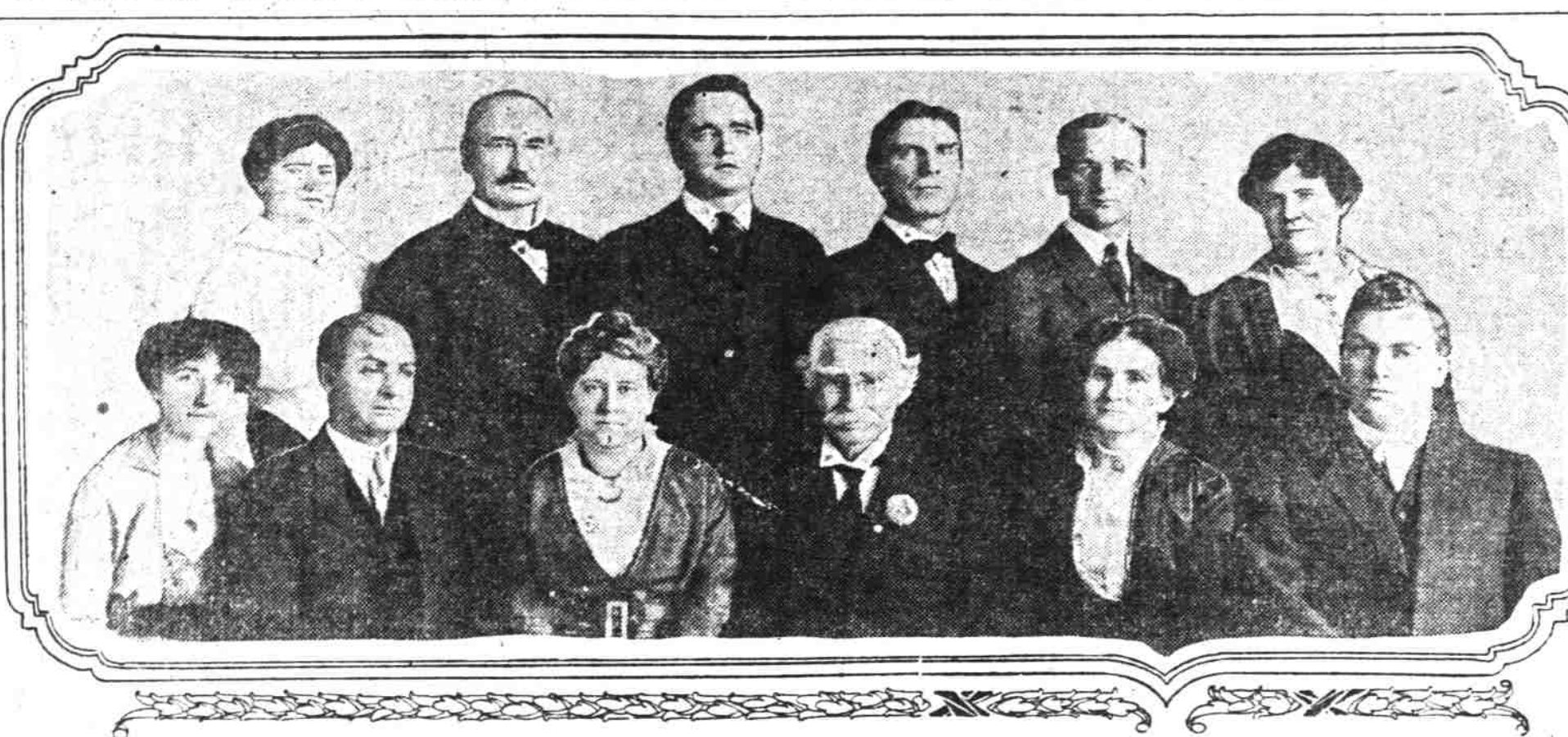
Gathering Will Be Held in Lents Evangelical Church; Dry Amendment Candidates to Speak.
