

### NO FATALITIES IN THE LIST OF ACCIDENTS AS REPORTED FOR WEEK

Sawmills and Wood Working  
Plants Occasion Majority  
of Injuries to Workmen.

### TOTAL OF SEVENTY-ONE

Railroad Work Responsible for Eighteen  
Highways of the

Salem, Or., Oct. 31.—No fatalities  
were reported to Labor Commissioner  
Holst during the week from the vari-

## Zeppelins Trained To Fire Torpedoes

Germany Finds New Use for Air Craft  
—Accordingly, Necessary Equipment  
is Installed.  
London, Oct. 31.—The Milan corre-  
spondent of the Daily Mail sends the  
following:  
For the past few days Zeppelins  
have been practicing the firing of tor-  
pedoes from a great height, using as  
targets rafts floating on Lake Con-  
stance. It is reported the result has  
been so satisfactory that the German  
authorities are equipping a fleet of  
Zeppelins with tubes and torpedo ap-  
paratus, which will be ready in a few  
months to cooperate in naval attacks in  
the North Sea.
